Possible actions include a determination whether the deficiencies identified in the Notice of Intent to Terminate Nevada Virtual Academy's Charter School Contract have or have not been corrected or taking no further action.

The performance framework rated the school a one star rating. This is below the State Public Charter School Authority standard. Charter schools are held at the same standard as any other school. Director Gavin gave

information on the school. Kara Hendricks, the counsel for NVA gave a presentation on the cure and response regarding the termination process. Samantha Morris provided a PowerPoint on the performance and test ratings.
