SPCSA Class of 2019-20 4-Year Graduation Rates





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Overview: Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates (ACGR)

- Schools start with a "cohort" of first-time 9th graders in a particular school year.
 - For the class of 2019-20, the cohort entered 9th grade in the 2016-17 school year.
- The cohort is "adjusted" by:
 - Adding students who transfer in after the 9th grade.
 - Subtracting students who transfer out.
- The 4-year ACGR is the percent of students in this cohort graduating within four years.
 - ACGR = # graduates / (# graduates + # non-graduates) * 100
- 4- and 5-year ACGRs are included in the annual high school NSPF (Nevada school ratings).
 - The 4-year ACGR is worth up to 25 points, while the 5-year ACGR is worth up to 5 points.
 - The NSPF is worth a possible 100 points.



Graduation Rates Highlights

The 4-year graduation rate for the SPCSA class of 2019-20 is 84.2%— the first time the SPCSA has outperformed the state.

The SPCSA graduation rate improved by 6.4 percentage points over last year, an increase larger than all but two Nevada districts.

Ten SPCSA schools have a 100% graduation rate.

Fourteen of seventeen SPCSA schools are at or above their graduation rate from last year.


Year over year, SPCSA graduation rates increased for ALL student groups.

Seven of ten SPCSA student groups outperformed their state group, including Students with Disabilities (IEP) and English Language Learners (ELL).

Almost half of SPCSA graduates received an Advanced or College and Career Ready (CCR) diploma.




4-Year Graduation Rate Trend SPCSA vs. State


Class of 2019-20 4-Year Graduation Rates SPCSA vs. Nevada

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
Change in 4-Year Graduation Rates SPCSA vs. Nevada



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
4-Year Graduation Rate Trends SPCSA Student Groups


4-Year Graduation Rate Trends SPCSA Student Groups



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
Class of 2019-20 4-Year Graduation Rates SPCSA vs. State Student Groups

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Graduation Rates Conclusions

- The 4-year graduation rate for the SPCSA class of 2019-20 is 84.2%, the first time the SPCSA has outperformed the state.
- The SPCSA graduation rate improved by 6.4 percentage points, an increase surpassing all but two districts.
- Ten SPCSA schools had a 100% graduation rate, more than twice the number of schools last year.
- Fourteen of seventeen SPCSA schools are at or above their rate from last year.
- Year over year, SPCSA graduation rates increased for ALL student groups including: every race/ethnicity group;
 Economically Disadvantaged Students (FRL); Students with Disabilities (IEP); English Language Learners (ELLs);
 CTE Students; Foster Students; and Homeless Students.
- Seven of ten SPCSA student groups outperformed their state group, including: students identifying as Asian, Black/African American, White, Two or More Races, or Pacific Islander; Students with Disabilities (IEP); and English Language Learners (ELLs).
- Almost half of SPCSA graduates received an Advanced or College and Career Ready (CCR) diploma.
