## CCSD, Demographics, Zoning and GIS (DZG) response:

The provided location of intended service encompass a geographic area with twenty-nine elementary schools. Through the 2015 Capital Improvement Program the Clark County School District has invested considerably within and around the stated area. A new Career and Technical Academy is schedule to open in North Las Vegas in 2023 which will provide some enrollment relief to the area high schools. Three of these schools have received a replacement facility: Griffith Elementary School (2019), Twin Lakes Elementary School (2019) and Wasden Elementary School (2020). Six elementary schools have received building additions, adding needed capacity and modernization; Bunker Elementary School (2018), Culley Elementary School (2018), Fong Elementary School (2018), Reed Elementary School (2018), Ronzone Elementary School (2018), and McWilliams Elementary School (2020).



As you know, the SPCSA approved the Academic and Demographic Needs Assessment on July 26, 2019 and published an updated version on December 13, 2019.

Our staff and board will be evaluating the degree to which the applicant aligns with the identified needs. Provided below is information regarding the analysis of TEACH Las Vegas Academy, in reference to the applicant aligning with the identified needs of the community.

**Demographics:** The application <u>does not</u> provide evidence of service to the required demographics (students qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch, English learners, and students with IEPs), at the 4624-4660 N. Rancho Drive, Las Vegas, NV, 89130 proposed location.

## **Academic Geographies:**

The proposed location <u>does not</u> align with serving the intended academic geographies, and <u>does not</u> meet the criteria of serving elementary, middle and high school geographies with 1- and 2-Star schools.

**Social Emotional:** The applicant <u>does</u> provide information regarding the school's ability to address the social and emotional needs of the stated demographics.

**Academic Learning Models:** The applicant <u>does not</u> provide evidence of a typical learning model. Although, both project based learning and blended learning models were referenced, there were no clear examples of academic results the school has produced through the use of either methodology in regard to serving the required populations.

**Financial Plan:** The applicant <u>does</u> provide initial financial analysis and information.

**Successful History:** The applicant <u>does not</u> demonstrate the capacity in which it previously successfully supported student populations in grades K-12 in achieving academic performance at or above the State average.
