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GUIDANCE RECOMMENDATION

TO: State Public Charter School Authority **FROM:** Rebecca Feiden, Executive Director **SUBJECT:** COVID-19 In-Person Learning Guidance

DATE: February 26, 2021

Recommendation

Under the current COVID-19 In-Person Learning Guidance, which the Authority approved on November 6, 2020, a school located in a county that is subject to Mitigation Level I or II pursuant to the Governor's COVID-19 Mitigation and Management Task Force must operate under a distance education or hybrid model, with the option to provide in-person instruction at a limited scale (less than 40% of the school's enrollment at any given time) and subject to all prevailing directives, including but not limited to Emergency Directive 038 issued on February 17, 2021. Note that the limit for in-person learning was originally 25% of the school's enrollment. Additionally, throughout this school year, several exemptions to this limit were provided to SPCSA-sponsored charter schools that demonstrated need and strong safety measures.

In the last month, Nevada has seen a significant decline in COVID-19 cases and the test positivity rate, though rates continue to remain high. In addition, in each of the counties in which SPCSA-sponsored schools are located, educators are now eligible for and receiving vaccinations. Over the last six months, SPCSA-sponsored schools have developed, implemented, and refined protocols for mitigating the risk of transmission of COVID-19 and responding to possible and confirmed cases within their school communities. Through focus groups, many school leaders conveyed a strong interest in increasing in-person learning to better meet the educational needs of their students. Finally, on February 12, 2021, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) released updated guidance, including an *Operational Strategy for K-12 School through*

<u>Phased Mitigation</u>. The CDC guidance emphasizes 1) Implementation of mitigation strategies with a particular focus on universal and correct use of masks and physical distancing, 2) Monitoring indicators of community transmission, and 3) Implementation of phased mitigation, learning modes, and testing. To be clear, this guidance does not suggest a wholesale return to inperson learning, but rather provides concrete recommendations for in-person learning at varying levels of community transmission.

Based on these factors, I recommend that the SPCSA remove the additional limits on inperson learning, specifically 40% of the school's enrollment, for counties flagged by the COVID-19 Mitigation and Management Task Force. Importantly, SPCSA-sponsored schools will continue to be subject to all prevailing directives, including but not limited to <u>Emergency Directive 038</u>.

Continued Support and Oversight

SPCSA Staff will **support** schools with determining and implementing their instructional model through:

- 1) Continued information sharing of directives and guidance
- 2) Increased focus on ensuring a deep understanding of prevailing guidance and recommendations, including local, state and federal
- 3) Regular updates on measures identified by the CDC for weekly monitoring

SPCSA Staff will **oversee** the implementation of instructional models through

- 1) Review of updated *Re-Opening Plans* and *Instructional Model Overview* documents (see Appendix A) when a school plans to make a change to the instructional model
- 2) Ongoing weekly communication with schools (both one-on-one and via all-school conference calls)
