FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

1. INSTRUCTORS

Instructors shall be provided as follows: *(Check the appropriate line)*

- Charter School shall provide all instructors
 University of Nevada Las Vegas shall provide and pay all instructors
 Each party shall provide and pay for instructors as follows:

Charter School instructors approved by the UNLV academic department offering the course shall receive:

- 1) \$250.00 per dual credit section taught from University of Nevada Las Vegas. This is provided to each high school instructor once per semester for each section of dual enrollment course during the traditional school day or remotely.
- 2) Currently, CCSD pays extra duty pay of 10 hours at \$22.00/hour (for a total of \$220.00) from the Clark County School District for each semester taught. This is provided to each instructor once per semester. *Charter schools may choose how or if to compensate instructors until further notice*

UNLV academic faculty, faculty in residence, part time instructors, and graduate teaching assistants who are teaching dedicated sections of college courses either on campus or at the high school will be compensated based upon existing discipline based pay scales.

2. PAYMENTS OF TUITION AND FEES:

As of AY23 University of Nevada Las Vegas registration fees are seventy-five dollars (\$75) per three unit course or (\$150) per credit for each individual student in each dual credit course.
