In December of 2019, the State Public Charter School Authority approved a, five-year strategic plan that is focused on empowering communities and inspiring students.

Vision: Equitable access to diverse, innovative, and high-quality public schools for every Nevada student.

Mission: The SPCSA sponsors, supports, and oversees dynamic and responsive public charter schools that prepare all students for academic, social, and economic success.

Goal 1: Provide Families with Access to High-Quality Schools

The SPCSA aims for all sponsored schools to meet academic, organizational and financial performance standards.

1a. Improve upon existing strong performance on the Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) by achieving 70% four-star or better, 83% three-star or better, no more than 17% two-star, and less than 4% one star (excluding Alternative Performance Framework Schools).
