Jackson Olsen, Ed.D., is the Director of High School Leadership Development at the KIPP Foundation where he coaches and supports high school principals and principal supervisors across the country. Before joining KIPP, he was the Founding High School Principal at Henderson Collegiate High School, an independent Title I charter school in North Carolina. Dr. Olsen's school was in the top 3% of all public schools in the state, earned an "A" rating for 4 out of 5 years, and was named a Title I School of Distinction during his tenure. Dr. Olsen also worked in district schools at the elementary, middle, and high school level as a teacher, assistant principal, and football and baseball coach.

Dr. Olsen was a member of the 2021 Leverage Leadership Institute (LLI) Fellowship and the 2015 National Principals Academy Fellowship (NPAF) through the Relay Graduate School of Education, completing both programs with honors.
