We are so looking forward to starting school this year & today I'm asking you to please allow us to continue opening with our hybrid plan.

2020 has been a year full of unknowns. However, our amazing principal has lead the administration team in developing a reopening plan that is in the best interest of the Doral student body. They have spent countless hours during spring and summer to have solid plans no matter the situation. These plans not only are what a majority of our parents and staff want, but they are backed by science.

While there is no way to be perfectly safe during this pandemic, we can mitigate the risk. The comprehensive plan that our school has submitted does exactly that. Following federal, state, and local guidelines, students are required to wear a mask. The school will only open at 50% capacity, with an additional day of cleaning with no children present. These are only some of the ways that the school will do whatever they can to keep our kids safe while still offering as "normal" an experience in school as possible. Our plan is safe and was written with direct advice from the head of our only local pediatric hospital. That said, with the new recommendation, it would be impossible to operate the hybrid plan.
