2. Does the School District's Capital Improvement Plan include any plans to add new schools or add additional capacity to existing schools within the community in which the applicant proposes to locate?

As part of the 2015 Capital Improvement Program, the Clark County School District (CCSD) has invested substantially in the 89030 zip code to address much-needed capacity and modernization needs. In 2017, CCSD completed a full replacement of Lincoln Elementary School. Jo Mackey Elementary School and J. D. Smith Middle School

are both currently under construction, scheduled for completion before the 2020-2021 school year. Beginning the 2020-2021 school year, Jo Mackey will expand the Leadership and Global Communication Magnet Program to include student's kindergarten through 8th-grade, providing greater opportunities for families in the 89030-zip code. In 2018, building additions were completed at Lois Craig, and C. P. Squires Elementary Schools, adding additional building capacity.

3. The SPCSA approved the Academic and Demographic Needs Assessment on July 26, 2019. Our staff and board will be evaluating the degree to which the applicant aligns with the identified needs. Please provide any input as to how this applicant does or does not meet identified needs in the community. If district staff or Board of Trustees has had prior communications with this applicant, please provide any relevant information or details from that communication that might be useful to the SPCSA in making an informed decision regarding the application.

Demographics: Application <u>does</u> provide evidence of service to the required demographics (meets). Applicant <u>does</u> clearly propose a school model that includes demonstrated capacity or credible plans, to intentionally serve the following student populations, each of which have on aggregate, historically underperformed based on data provided by the Nevada Department of Education: Students qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch, English learners, and students with IEPs. As stated in the proposed application, the school is specifically targeting a population based on socioeconomics. The applicant has demonstrated the capacity in which it previously successfully supported these student populations in grades 6 - 12 in achieving academic performance at or above the State average. The applicant <u>does not</u> demonstrate the capacity in which it previously successfully supported these student populations in grades K - 5 in achieving academic performance at or above the formance at or above the State average.

Academic Need: Geographies with 1- and 2-Star schools - Applicants meeting this need will seek to provide access to 3-, 4-, and 5-Star schools in zip codes where students are attending a 1- or 2-Star school. The applicant has proposed a location in the area of North Las Vegas that <u>does</u> meet the criteria of elementary and middle school geographies with 1- and 2-Star schools with approximately 58 percent of the schools receiving ratings below 3-Stars on the 2018 – 2019 Nevada School Performance Framework. The application presents no proof of the founding board having successfully implemented a K - 5 program of this type elsewhere.

The applicant has proposed a location in the area of the 89030 zip code of North Las Vegas that <u>does not</u> meet the criteria of high school geographies with 1- and 2-Star schools. Rancho and Canyon Springs high schools, which are both Clark County School District magnet programs, service this zoned area and have a similar educational model as the CIVICA application proposes. Rancho High School received a 4-Stars rating, and Canyon Springs High School received a 3-Star rating on the 2018 – 2019 Nevada School Performance Framework.

There is no knowledge of official communication between the Clark County School District (CCSD) staff or the CCSD Board of Trustees with this applicant.

4. Are there currently any schools providing a similar educational model in the community in which the applicant proposes to locate? If yes, please provide any relevant information on the current school(s) with similar educational models that are available to students in the community.

The Clark County School District believes that existing schools in the proposed locations do offer similar types of opportunities.
