DECLARATION OF SHANNON S. PIERCE

- I, Shannon S. Pierce, hereby declare under penalty of perjury as follows:
- The matters set forth in this declaration are based on my own personal knowledge.
 If called upon to testify, I am competent to testify to the matters set forth herein.
- 2. I am the parent of an elementary school student with Nevada Connections

 Academy ("NCA"). I make this declaration in support of NCA relative to closure proceedings

 before the State Public Charter School Authority held on May 25, 26, and 27, 2017, and

 continued to an unspecified date in 2017.
- 3. My son has attended NCA since early 2017, and my husband and I are in the process of registering my daughter so that she can also attend NCA in the 2017-2018 school year. Both of our children will be in elementary school-level grades.
- 4. Previously, my son attended Excel Christian School in Sparks, Nevada. We decided to switch to NCA because we believed our son would benefit from a school environment that provided greater flexibility. In addition, at my son's prior school, he was beginning to fail for reasons unrelated to his academic ability. The school environment was far from positive, with teachers and administrators creating pressures that were causing my son to fail not because he could not understand the material, but because the pressure of performing in a traditional classroom environment (especially an environment run by teachers and administrators who did

not seem to understand my son's particular needs) was causing him to psyche himself out and underperform. At the same time, I was concerned that learning at NCA would be challenging for our family, in that my son might have trouble focusing on his tasks and motivating himself to stay on top of his classwork. I also worried that my son would not have any meaningful student-teacher interaction. My concerns began falling away as soon as I first interacted with my son's teacher. Before speaking with my son, the teacher called me to learn about my son's interests. Upon learning that he is a Star Wars fanatic, the teacher then held a lengthy call with my son where they talked about little other than Star Wars. This went a long way, as some of my son's prior teachers had traumatized him to the point that he didn't want to interact with teachers or learn anything from them. By making the choice to devote the first interaction to discussing Star Wars with my son, the teacher gained instant credibility in my son's eyes, which carried over into the learning experience.

- 5. My family and I have regular interaction with my son's teacher. My son's teacher holds bi-weekly calls with my son, both to gauge his progress and to identify issues that may be interfering with his learning. My son's teacher is also available by email or phone if we need to contact her outside of our normally scheduled calls. She has always timely responded to the emails I have sent her. I have also communicated with the NCA staff on several occasions about issues such as registration and IT issues. The NCA staff has always been professional and helpful.
- 6. In addition to personalized interaction with teachers, I was pleasantly surprised to learn how user-friendly NCA's curriculum and systems are. NCA has time-management systems in place to enable my son to stay on top of his curriculum while also gaining the flexibility he needs. In other words, my son can now get his classwork done on his schedule, but NCA's software, regular teacher interactions, and other systems ensure that he stays on track to

succeed. By enabling my son to have greater flexibility while also ensuring that he stays on track to learn what he needs to learn, NCA has enabled my son to rebuild his self-confidence and succeed. In fact, whereas my son was receiving low marks toward the end of his time at his last school (due to his struggles in that environment, not due to a lack of comprehension), he is ending this year with all A's. His grades now reflect how incredibly smart he is. And while my son probably wouldn't admit it, I believe he is starting to enjoy learning again. In his spare time, he now picks up books to read. He never did that at his prior school.

7. Regarding the quality of academics at NCA, I was initially worried that since we were transitioning from a private school to an online public school, the curriculum may not have been advanced enough for my son. I was wrong. Immediately upon starting at NCA, my son was expected to perform complex language arts and math assignments that far surpassed what he was learning at his prior school. He was also required to learn handwriting (cursive), which his prior school had not begun to teach him. Beyond the subject matter being taught, however, I was impressed with the manner in which students are expected to prepare their work. At my son's prior school, when he was given a writing assignment, he was given one opportunity to write down whatever he was going to write, and then he was done. At NCA, my son has learned how to outline a writing assignment, prepare a first draft, and then polish that draft. While my son regularly complains about being required to complete assignments this way (since it requires much more effort on his part), this process is so good for him in that it prepares him for life after school. In my career as a trial attorney, I am constantly preparing motions and other documents to be submitted to the courts. The process I follow is the same that NCA is teaching: I outline (either in my head or on paper) what I want to convey to the courts, then I write a draft, then I polish that draft until it is up to my (and my clients') standards. It is comforting to know that

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NCA is teaching this same system to my son, so that he can be successful in whatever career he ends up choosing.

- 8. As the parent of an NCA student, I have the opportunity to be more involved in my son's education, which can also involve more work for me at times. My husband and I do not have the luxury of sending our kids to someone else for 6 hours per day. My husband is the primary learning coach for my son (since I work full time), and I regularly see him sitting with his laptop in the evenings planning out the next day so that the learning day will proceed more smoothly. I have also served as a learning coach for my son and have been pleasantly surprised by how user-friendly each lesson is. I appreciate that the Connections internet platform gives us, for each lesson, both a student page and a learning coach page. The learning coach page contains helpful suggestions for how to respond to certain questions and otherwise assess whether my son is learning the material at issue in that particular lesson.
- 9. I hope for the chance to continue to educate my son at NCA because it works for my son's learning style and has provided him with the environment necessary to excel in school, and even to enjoy learning. Our satisfaction with the school is evident in our decision to register our daughter with NCA for the upcoming year.
