Our after school program thrives because so many of our families need the additional care as they work all over Las Vegas. Many of the students in my classroom are from single family households and the after school program allows the students to come to Discovery. We are fortunate to know many grandparents, aunts and uncles and friends of families because they are quick to help one another with transportation. Many parents sacrifice time and ease or convenience to bring their children to Discovery. There are many perks to our little school such as smaller class sizes, less classes overall so staff really knows the students regardless of grade level. We pride ourselves on being a close knit group who truly care for one another. While we want to increase our school size, rest assured it is not by an overly large amount and we would still maintain a small close knit community. Waitlist continues to grow for middle school and kindergarten

Finally, as we get ready for winter break and I work on report cards and look at the data from our recent winter assessments I am even more inspired to want more for our wonderful students. I have seen growth like I have never seen in my nineteen years of teaching. These kids are working so hard to fill in gaps that happened with school closures and online learning. We worked hard during the Covid years and even though I met students daily online and worked hard to help there are gaps. These kids have stepped up and are showing us how amazing they are. They are dealing with divorce, death, poverty and yet they are thriving. I hope you will give us a chance to show what we can do with more resources to help all of our students thrive. We don't care where they live or what their background is. What matters is that we are a community who works together. Our kids belong at Discovery whatever their zip code is.
