The provided zip code of intended service encompass a geographic area with six high schools. Through the 2015 Capital Improvement Program the Clark County School District (District) is constructing the new 600-seat Central Technical Training Academy (2022), a new 1,800-seat career and technical high school (2023) which will provide opportunities for students from this area, a cafeteria addition at Eldorado High School (2025) and the replacement of Dell Robison Middle School with a 1,000-seat choice high school program (2027) in zip code 89110.

As you know, the SPCSA approved the Academic and Demographic Needs Assessment on July 26, 2019 and approved an updated version on January 22, 2021. Our staff and board will be evaluating the degree to which the applicant aligns with the identified needs. The District will open the Central Technical Training Academy in August of 2022 located at 1725 South Maryland Parkway. This program will focus on career pathway training through Career and Technical Education programs, industry certifications, and work-based learning opportunities – will have flexible scheduling that incorporates in-person, hybrid, and distance-learning options. The academy will be a school of choice for students from across the District during the day. During the evening, the academy will have training opportunities for concurrently enrolled high school and adult education students.
