



Creation and Purpose


The purpose of the State Public Charter School Authority is to:

Provide oversight to the charter schools that it sponsors to ensure that those charter schools maintain high educational and operational standards, preserve autonomy and safeguard the interests of pupils and the community.

Serve as a model of the best practices in sponsoring charter schools and foster a climate in this State in which all high-quality charter schools, regardless of sponsor, can flourish. ”




Overview of Schools and Students Served



There are 78 charter school campuses sponsored by the SPCSA located across five counties: Churchill, Clark, Elko, Washoe, and White Pine. Of the school campuses sponsored by the SPCSA, about 85% are located in Clark County.








SPCSA-Sponsored Schools Demonstrate Higher Rates of Proficiency in a National Comparison




ELA Proficiency

SPCSA-Sponsored Schools Outperform the State, but Title I schools are Less Likely to Earn an Index Score of 50+






Academic Performance Framework

- The SPCSA adopted a new Academic Performance Framework (APF) in 2019 that is based on:
 - School Index Score (NSPF);
 - Performance comparisons (NSPF index score) to the local school district and nearby school; and
 - Enrollment diversity compared to the local school district.

Site Evaluations

- The SPCSA conducts site evaluations at each school campus, at minimum, in the first, third and fifth years of the charter contract.
- Each site evaluation involves document submissions, classroom observations, and focus groups.
- For the 2022-23 school year, the SPCSA has 57 site evaluations scheduled, with 23 complete as of January 1, 2023.



Organizational Performance Framework

- The SPCSA approved a new Organizational Performance Framework (OPF) in 2019 with five major categories:
 - Education Program
 - Financial Management and Oversight
 - Governance and Reporting
 - Students and Employees
 - School Environment
- The Organizational Framework takes into account over 40 annual compliance requirements and is focused on answering the question: *Is the organization effective and well run?*
- For the 2021-2022 school year, 100% of charter holders met standards on the Organizational Performance Framework.

Financial Performance Framework

- The SPCSA approved a new Financial Performance Framework (FPF) in 2019 with four near-term measures and four sustainability measures.
- The Financial Framework is focused on answering the question: *Is the school financially viable?*
- For the 2020-2021 school year, 95% of charter holders met standards on the Financial Performance Framework. Ratings for the 2021-22 school year will be presented at the March 3, 2023 Board Meeting.


Goal 2


All SPCSA Student Groups Outperformed their State Peers in 3rd-8th Grade Math and ELA



Data shown are percent point differences in proficiency between each SPCSA and corresponding state student group, for the 2021-22 Smarter Balanced assessments.




Most SPCSA Student Groups Outperformed their State Peers in 11th Grade Math and ELA






Most SPCSA student groups had graduation rates that exceeded the respective statewide student group







New SPCSA Schools that Opened in Recent Years are More Reflective of State Enrollment Rates









SPCSA Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) Adjusted Index Scores Trend







SPCSA vs. State: Schools With 50+ NSPF Score (2021-22 School Year)














3rd-8th Grade Smarter Balanced Assessment: SPCSA Math Proficiency Versus State (2021-22)




3rd-8th Grade Smarter Balanced Assessment: SPCSA ELA Proficiency Versus State (2021-22)




11th Grade ACT Assessment: SPCSA Math Proficiency Trends




11th Grade ACT Assessment: SPCSA English Language Arts Proficiency Trends




4-Year Graduation Rates: SPCSA Schools (Class of 2021-22)





4-Year Graduation Rates: SPCSA Student Group Trends





4-Year Graduation Rates: SPCSA Comparison to State (Class of 2021-22)










