

# Proposed changes to the SPCSA Academic Performance Framework

## I. Introduction and Background

Three versions of the Academic Performance Framework have been drafted. The chart below outlines some of the similarities and some of the big differences that are proposed based on the interview and focus group data collected for this project. Please note that there is more flexibility to move measures around and add/ delete measures as long as per statute, the academic component of the framework must address charter school: (1) academic achievement and proficiency, including academic growth; (2) disparities in academic achievement and proficiency; and (3) graduation rates as well as college and career readiness (where relevant).

Below the chart, we included new Academic Performance Framework visuals for each version to show the indicators, measures for each indicator, and the display only information.

The following questions were used to guide the development of these versions:

1. Is the Academic Performance Framework measuring what is required by law?
2. Is the Academic Performance Framework measuring outcomes that are charter-specific?
3. Is the Academic Performance Framework measuring outcomes that are specific to the community that the charter was built to serve?
4. Is the Academic Performance Framework adding to the school burden?
5. Is the Academic Performance Framework measuring outcomes that are out of the school's control?
6. Is the Academic Performance Framework providing clear, concise information for stakeholders, especially families?
7. Is the Academic Performance Framework aligned to valuing a community-based school?

## II. Overview of Academic Performance Framework Versions

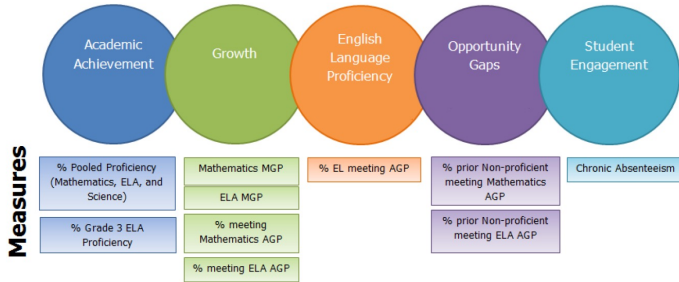

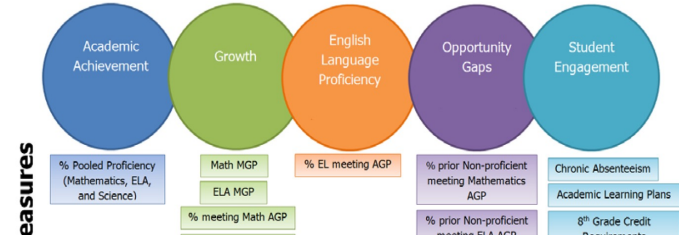

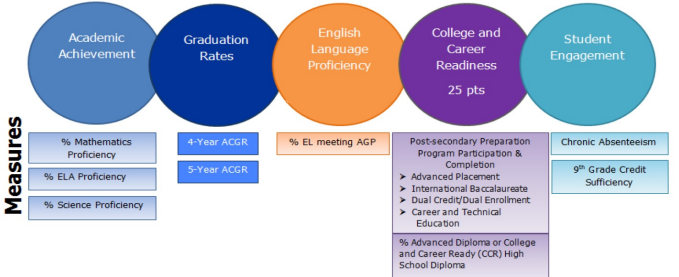
**Elementary School Performance Framework**

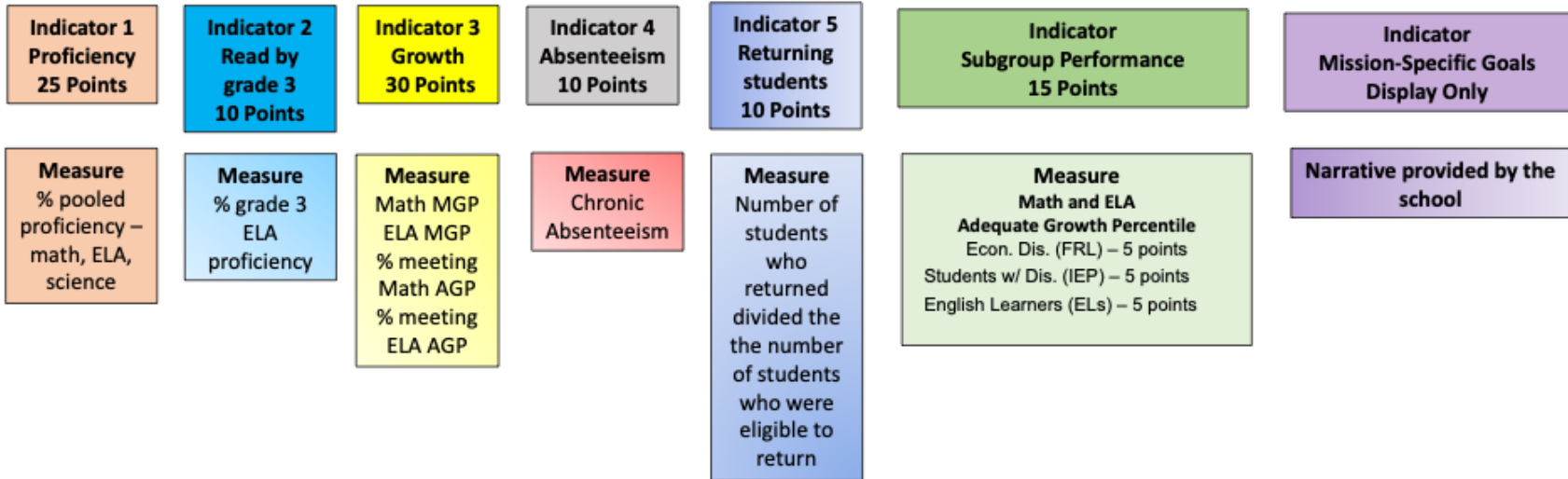

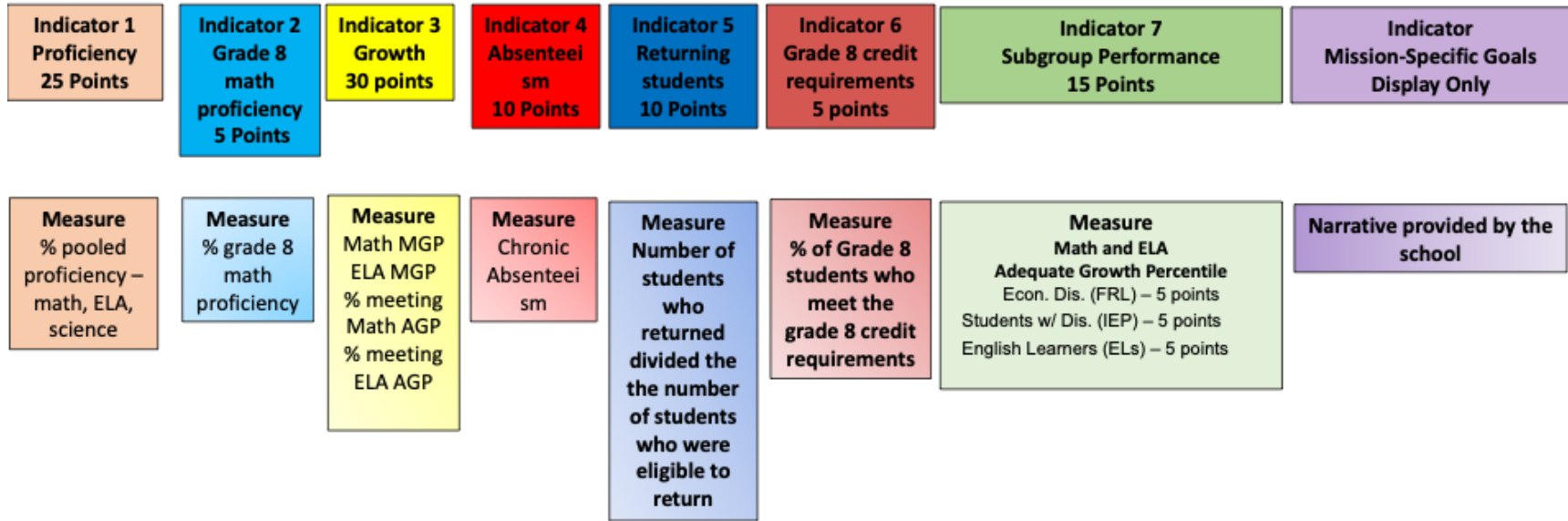
