			On 7/9/24 the school indicated they made a \$70K payment the week of July 1-5. They will continue to make this level of payment while simultaneously work to close a loan in mid-August that would allow them to pay the balance in full.
			On 7/18 the school received notice that PERS had conditionally accepted their repayment plan of \$42,000 a month. A plan the Explore board was not able to approve on 7/17/24 as they did not have a quorum. That meeting was rescheduled to 7/24/24.
Teach Las Vegas	\$45,754.36		Past Due 10/31 was \$380,387.00. SPCSA staff has requested the school prioritize the PERS repayment.
Equipo Academy	\$340,741.73	6/6/24 \$129,246.14	SPCSA staff met w/ PERS on 7/10 regarding Equipo. Equipo made no payment in July 23, December 23 or March 24.

	was the overpayment

	PERS payment. PERS
	will not automatically
	apply the
	overpayments, Equipo
	must request this and
	they have not done so.
	On 7/10/24 SPCSA
	staff asked the school
	to submit a repayment
	plan to PERS if they
	were unable to pay the
	entire balance off on
	7/15/24. The school
	has not responded to
	that email.
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PERS conducted a training with new schools opening in the 24-25 school year on June 26th. They report that all school attended. At that time each school did have outstanding paperwork that was necessary to get fully enrolled so each school left with "homework." PERS will provide an update on the progress these schools are making regarding enrollment.

Exceptional Growth Audits

The SPCSA conducts an audit in June for any of our charter schools that are experiencing exceptional growth of 25% or more in the upcoming school year. These audits allow the school to start receiving the appropriate PCFP payments in the first quarter of the upcoming school year. The following table represents that work.
