- Dr. Joan Sando, pioneer in Nevada's charter school movement, started EKA








#### **OUR BOARD**

#### HOURS AND TRANSPORTATION

- Students attend Tuesday Friday. Monday is "Home Learning Day"
- Elementary hours are from 7:55 am to 3:10 pm. Secondary hours are from 7:55 am to 3:40 pm
- Families must provide their own transportation
- Local daycares provide Monday care and bus transportation before and after school for families
- EKA has Explore More Mondays program for elementary students for academic enrichment, social skills and FUN.




# Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) for FY 24

## **DEMOGRAPHICS CONTINUED**



#### Goals

- 1. Student Success Increase the percentage of elementary students proficient in mathematics from 31% to 55.8%, as measured by the state, Spring 2025, elementary math assessment. Increase the percentage of middle school students proficient in mathematics from 40.7% to 45.6%, as measured by the state, Spring 2025, math assessment. Increase the percentage of elementary students proficient in science from 17.4% to 55.8 as measured by the state, Spring 2025 science assessment. Increase the percentage of high school students achieving post secondary preparation from 57.8 to 75 as measured by the FY 25 NSPF rating.
- 2. Adult Learning Culture By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 100% of teachers will have participated in a book study and 75% of classroom observations will show evidence of learning opportunities designed to support English Learners as measured by classroom walkthrough data.
- 3. Connectedness Increase the percent of elementary school students who feel safe at school from 60% to a 82% as measured by the NV-SCSEL survey. Increase the percent of middle school students who feel safe at school from 67% to a 82% as measured by the 2024-2025 NV-SCSEL survey. Increase the percent of high school students who feel safe at school from 68% to a 82% as measured by the 2024-2025 NV-SCSEL survey.
