## RFA: Reduce in Enrollment in Existing Grade Levels

The SPCSA considers reductions to an approved enrollment cap to be a material change of the charter contract and require approval by the State Public Charter School Authority Board.

Signature Preparatory Charter School is a Kindergarten  $-8^{th}$  Grade Elementary and Middle School located at 498 South Boulder Highway; Henderson, Nevada 89015. The Quarter 1 ADE for the 2024-2025 School Year was 960 students.

Signature Preparatory initiated operations during the 2019-2020 school year. Despite having commenced its inaugural year during the COVID-19 pandemic, Signature Preparatory has continually increased enrollment from 577 students (2019-2020), 790 students (2020-2021), 895 students (2021-2022), and has held steady the past two years at approximately 960 students (2022-2023, 2023-2024). Signature Preparatory anticipated 1,000 students for the 2024-2025 school year. Moreover, during this time Signature Preparatory has increased the overall percentages of K-8 students reading and math proficiency levels by 25.2% (Reading) and 35.1% (Math).

The School's Leadership consists of Mr. Gabe Shirey, Executive Director; Dr. Carey Roybal-Benson, Principal; Ms. Danielle Strough, Assistant Principal; and Mr. Joseph Rekrut, Dean.

Signature Preparatory's Board of Directors is comprised of 7 people.

Signature Preparatory's mission is to provide the best educational experience to as many students as possible in a moral and wholesome environment. Signature Preparatory will deliver academic excellence and provide meaningful extra-curricular activities for students in athletics, the arts, technology, entrepreneurship, and leadership. Signature Preparatory's values will be the foundation of its mission and vision. Signature Preparatory will PRAISE leaders through Purpose, Respect, Accountability, Integrity, Service and Empathy. Our PRAISE values allow employees to judge the importance, value, and attractiveness of any given situation, and prioritize decisions independently and consistently to the school's mission and vision. In order to be leaders, and help our students become leaders, Signature Preparatory employees must integrate each of these values into their way of being.

2. A summary explanation of the reasons that the charter school is seeking to make this specific requested change.

Analysis of Signature Preparatory's enrollment data for the current school year (2024-2025) and previous two school years (2022-2023, 2023-2024) [post-COVID Pandemic], demonstrate a consistent capacity to sustain an approximate enrollment between 935 to 950 students.

The current charter expiring on June 30, 2025 and the renewed charter starting July 1, 2025 have been approved for 1,080 students. The minimum threshold (10% less of the approval quantity) of 1,080 students is 972 students.

From year-to-year, Signature Preparatory reaches combined student enrollments (re-enrollment/open) beyond 972 students (for example, 1,006 students 2023-24). However, from the start of academic years and as the academic years progress, the school experiences transiency (both in and out). Although the transiency includes both those withdrawing and new enrollment, the total combined student enrollment typically lowers on average from the first day of the academic years by about 40-60 students once the academic years are well underway. Within academic year transiency typically positions the school's enrollment somewhere between 935 to 970 students. This is confirmed by both the 2023-2204 Quarter 4 ADE of 939 students and the 2024-2025 Q1 ADE of 960 students.

3. Specifically identify the key reasons associated with this reduction in your enrollment cap.

While both the previous charter term and the renewed charter term were approved for 1,080 students, Signature Preparatory is seeking to reduce the enrollment cap by 130 students in existing grade levels (K-8) from 1,080 students to 950 students for the 2025-2026 school year and beyond.

Specifically, this reduction in enrollment cap is being requested because of the following material facts:

1. Analyzing enrollment figures for the immediate school year (2024-2025) and the previous two school years (2022-2023, 2023-2024), the school's leadership team, in collaboration with the school's Educational Management Organization (EMO) have proven a capacity to consistently sustain school enrollment of approximately 950 students (see table). These last three years have been selected for analysis because Signature Preparatory initiated operations of its inaugural year in 2019-2020 and for the first three years of existence were materially affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic. School enrollment figures from these first three years were judged not reliable due to the nature of impact that the COVID-19 Pandemic had on Nevada, Clark County School District, Las Vegas, and Henderson families during this time.

2. The physical location of Signature Preparatory is situated within a highly saturated area of other charter school options (5 schools with 3 miles) and 7 traditional elementary and 3 traditional middle school/junior high public schools within 5 miles. While the area surrounding the school continues to experience growth (new homes in the Cadence Development and new apartments on Boulder Highway), it is school leadership's belief that this may not result in the amount of new enrollment necessary to consistently enroll 1,080 students or consistently above the mandated minimum enrollment threshold (972 students, 10% less than 1,080 students).

#### **Operations and Enrollment**

1. Describe the rationale for the reduction in enrollment.

While both the previous charter term and the renewed charter term were approved for 1,080 students, Signature Preparatory is seeking to reduce this enrollment cap by 130 students in existing grade levels (K-8) from 1,080 students to 950 students for the 2025-2026 school year and beyond.

Over the past three years [post COVID-19 Pandemic], school enrollment quantities have normalized and remained consistently between 935-960. During these years, School Leadership, in cooperation with the EMO, has taken steps to match human resources and operational costs in alignment with the this already reduced number of students (under the enrollment cap: 1,080 students). The school is already positioned to serve approximately 960 students and has operated at this level for the past three years. Therefore, making this reduction in enrollment is without significant risk(s) to current operations or meeting financial obligations.

3. Describe the role to date of any parents, neighborhood, and/or community members involved in the proposed reduction in enrollment of the school.

Historic enrollment data and insights from the analysis of the data will be shared with families during February's Parent Townhall Meeting: Coffee with Carey. School Leadership will solicit feedback from the parents in attendance.

4. Describe how you will engage parents, neighborhood, and community members from the time that the application is approved. What specific strategies will be implemented to ensure students who have already enrolled in the school maintain that enrollment and are not adversely affected?

Historic enrollment data and insights from the analysis of the data will be shared with families during February's Parent Townhall Meeting: Coffee with Carey. Currently enrolled students will not be adversely affected by the enrollment reductions. At 950 students, the maximum threshold (10% beyond) of students that could be enrolled is 1,045. Given the historic enrollment data of the current year (2024-2025) and the previous two years (2022-2023 and 2023-2024) and Signature Preparatory.

# Signature Preparatory Enrollment Cap Financial Narrative

#### **Current Fiscal State**

Signature Preparatory Charter School (SIG PREP) has a stable financial outlook, despite an enrollment cap reduction from 1,030 to 955 students starting in FY2025. The FY2025 1st Interim Budget projects a net income of \$0, maintaining positive cash flow over the next six years, reaching \$582,702 by FY2030. Total revenues are projected to grow modestly from \$11.4 million in FY2025 to \$12.02 million by FY2030.

Key revenue drivers include steady per-pupil funding increases through the state's PCFP revenue program, rising from \$9,414 in FY2025 to \$10,393.82 by FY2030. Although the enrollment cap has been reduced, SIG PREP has adjusted its operational plan to ensure financial stability and sustainability.

The school has streamlined staffing and operational expenses to align with the lower enrollment cap, maintaining its commitment to academic quality and operational efficiency.

### **Financial Improvements and Sustainability Measures**

SIG PREP has implemented key financial adjustments in response to the enrollment cap reduction:

- **Debt Management**: Loan repayments continue as scheduled, with principal reductions averaging \$377,000 annually from FY2025 to FY2030, decreasing the loan balance by \$2.26 million over the term.
- **Operational Efficiencies**: Controlled spending with modest annual increases in total expenditures, averaging 1.7% from FY2025 to FY2030.
- Cash Reserves: Unrestricted cash is projected to remain stable, ending at \$2.94 million in FY2030, with unrestricted days of cash on hand maintained above 60 days.
- **Financial Performance Ratios**: Strong financial health with a current ratio exceeding 4.08x by FY2030 and a debt service coverage ratio of 2.18x, ensuring the school meets its financial obligations.

#### **Future Financial Plans**

SIG PREP's future strategies focus on:

- **Sustained Enrollment**: Maintaining an enrollment of 955-960 students annually through focused marketing, community engagement, and academic excellence.
- **Revenue Diversification**: Continued pursuit of federal and local funding, with consistent federal revenues of approximately \$635,000 annually and stable local revenues.
- **Staffing Adjustments**: Efficient staffing levels to match enrollment, with competitive salaries and benefits.
- **Operational Oversight**: Regular financial reviews to ensure spending aligns with budgetary expectations and strategic priorities.

## Conclusion

Despite the enrollment cap reduction, SIG PREP remains fiscally sound with strong cash reserves, prudent debt management, and efficient operations. The school is well-positioned to provide high-quality education while maintaining financial stability in the upcoming charter term.
