Summary of Request and Recommendation

Coral Academy of Science Las Vegas (CASLV) has submitted an amendment application requesting that the State Public Charter School Authority (SPCSA) grant a Good Cause Exemption and approve the request to modify the school's mission and vision statement and to reduce the enrollment cap for the Nellis campus.

SPCSA staff has reviewed the application and recommends that the Authority grant the Good Cause Exemption and approve the amendment request. A proposed motion along can be found on page 2 of this memo.

Background and Overview of the Amendment

Mission Modification Request

According to the amendment application CALSV has been working with the Governor's STEM Designation committee/OSIT as was notified via that partnership that the school's mission did not include any reference to science. The school explained in the application that they wanted to revise its mission statement to be more STEM-related but also keep the strengths of its current mission statement that are accurately reflected in its day-to-day operations. CALSV noted that STEM is an important component of its educational and extracurricular offerings and had become what the school is known for, which led the school to make this request.

The current mission of CASLV states "The mission of CASLV is to provide a safe, rigorous college preparatory environment that promotes social responsibility and a culturally diverse community dedicated to becoming lifelong learners bound for success."

The proposed mission is "To inspire and empower all students to achieve their highest potential through a rigorous college-preparatory, culturally responsive STEM education that fosters innovation, critical thinking, and a lifelong love of learning."

Reduction in Enrollment Cap at the Nellis campu

CASLV was approved by the Authority board at its March 1, 2024 meeting to increase the enrollment cap at the Nellis campus beginning in the 2026-27 school year. CASLV is working with the Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation (OLDCC) of the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) to expand the Nellis campus which is located on the Nellis Air Force Base. As part of the funding CASLV would receive through the OSD the OLDCC requested the campus be able to house more students of families who were stationed on the base. According to CASLV, due to long lead times on essential materials and equipment, the construction timeline had to be adjusted, and completion is now set for July 2027. Additionally, according to the amendment application, the overall scope of the project remains the same, but since construction has been delayed, the school does not have the space needed to house 1100 students beginning in the 2026-27 school year. As such, the school is adjusting the increase in the enrollment cap back one year to allow for the completion of the facility expansion.

The proposed enrollment cap for the Nellis campus will now be:

Legal Authority

Existing charter schools that are sponsored by the SPCSA may submit a charter school contract amendment application to the SPCSA – which is reviewed by SPCSA staff and presented for SPCSA Board action – to, among other things, increase enrollment, add grade levels above and beyond what the charter school is approved to serve, or add a new campus. When determining whether to approve an amendment request, the sponsor considers the charter school's compliance with applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations and evidence relating to the academics, finance and organization of the charter school.¹

Analysis and Staff Recommendation

When reviewing an amendment application for RFA eligibility, SPCSA staff reviews the academic, financial and organizational performance of the applicant charter school. In the case of CASLV, SPCSA staff finds the school to be meeting academic, financial and organizational performance expectations for all but one program (Nellis – ES 2-star). With the exception of the Nellis campus, the elementary, middle, and high school programs across the CASLV network are operating at 3, 4 and 5-star levels under the NSPF ratings for the 2024-25 school year, and either met or exceeded standards according to the 2023-2024 SPCSA Academic Performance results. Specific campus academic ratings are included on pages 7, 8, and 9 of this memo.

Additionally, the school earned 98 points (out of 100) under the SPCSA Organizational Performance Framework for the 2023 – 24 school year as approved by the Authority on October 4, 2024. As such, SPCSA staff finds the school to be Meeting Standards. CASLV has also been found to 'Meet the Standards' on the most recent 2024 SPCSA Financial Performance Framework.

Regarding the amendment request, SPCSA staff is recommending approval. The change to the school's mission is to further align the language to ensure Science is found in the mission. The change will not affect the ongoing operations of the school beyond bringing the mission into alignment with the school's day-to-day academic program.

Regarding the Nellis campus reduction, SPCSA staff is in support of this request too. While it is unfortunate there have been delays in the completion of the project, SPCSA staff recognizes the difficulties in facility projects and finds the request by CALSV to delay the increase in enrollment but one year to be both reasonable and needed.

Proposed Motion: Grant the Good Cause Exemption request and approve Coral Academy of Science Las Vegas requests to: reduce the enrollment cap at the Nellis campus and to modify the school's mission aw outlined in this memo with the following condition:

• That the school complete the SPSCA pre-opening process for new schools and campuses for occupation of the additional facility space at the Nellis campus.
