Re: Good Cause Exemption Request to Amend Charter School Contract

To State Public Charter School Authority,

Amendments may be submitted at any time throughout the school year if the Authority Board grants the good cause exemption request.

Introduction

Eligibility

To be eligible for consideration of a contract amendment, a school must submit a complete and accurate Request for Amendment following the requirements, directions, and deadlines stated herein. For SPCSA staff to recommend the approval of a Request for Amendment, the school should be in good standing in all three domains of the Authority's academic¹, financial, and organizational performance frameworks, and it must not be considered a low-performing school or otherwise ineligible according to any definition set forth in law or regulation.

For charter schools seeking to expand (i.e., adding a new campus, increasing grade levels, or raising their enrollment cap), strong applications typically include multiple years of meeting or exceeding state standards as defined by the Nevada Department of Education (NDE). Please note that charter school expansion requests must be submitted at least nine months before the proposed implementation date.

Ineligible schools may include, but are not limited to, schools that operate an elementary, middle, or high school with a 1- or 2- star Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) rating and/or receive a Does Not Meet Standard or Below Standard rating on the SPCSA Academic Performance Framework; schools that operate an elementary, middle, or high school program that is a priority or focus school; schools that operate high schools with graduation rates below 60%; schools with compliance issues, including participation warnings or penalties on the NSPF; and schools with financial or organizational framework deficiencies. A school that does not have at least one independent financial audit and one year of academic performance data is ineligible to apply for an expansion amendment.²

Types of Amendment

Requests for contract amendments that must be approved by the SPCSA board generally fall into one of the following categories, as outlined in [NRS 388A](#) and [NAC 388A](#).

- Enrollment adjustment:
 - Expand enrollment in existing grade levels
 - Expand enrollment in new grade levels
 - Reduce enrollment in existing grade levels
 - Eliminate a grade level or other educational service
- Add/adjust educational program components:
 - Distance education
 - Dual credit
- Management Organizations:
 - Entering into a new contract
 - Terminating the current contract

- Facilities:
 - Acquire/construct a new facility
 - Occupy a new or additional facility
 - Occupy a temporary facility
 - Consolidate existing locations
 - Closure of a campus within a charter network
- Other:
 - Change the mission statement, vision, or goals
 - Change the name of the school
 - Change conditions in the original or most recent contract
 - Transportation

If a charter school’s governing body seeks to amend its contract in a manner not explicitly listed above, it must submit a written request to the sponsor for a determination of whether the proposed change constitutes a material or nonmaterial amendment.

Requirements When Submitting a Request for Amendment

Notice of Intent

Any school interested in an amendment to its current charter contract must submit a Notice of Intent as part of the Fall or Spring Cycle. If the amendment is submitted outside of those cycles, it must include a Good Cause Exemption Request.

Application Submission Requirements

- Amendment requests must be developed using the templates provided.
- Completeness Check: Amendment requests will be vetted for completeness, including the submission of required attachments and confirmation of eligibility for the request.

Evaluation Process

Evaluators

Requests for charter contract amendments are evaluated by SPCSA staff.

Evaluation Areas

Evaluators will only recommend approval of a requested amendment if the school:

- Meets the eligibility requirements listed above.
- Meets the requirements of the completeness check.
- Provides a plan to implement the proposed changes to the school that is both comprehensive and feasible.
- Clearly demonstrates the financial feasibility of the proposed amendment.
- Presents a sufficiently detailed timeline for the implementation of the proposed changes.

Executive Summary

Eligibility

Pinecrest Academy of Nevada (Pinecrest) has met the State Public Charter School Authority's (SPCSA) financial and organizational performance standards for each of the past three years. While the Pinecrest Virtual high school program has not yet received an academic performance rating, the Pinecrest Virtual middle school program did receive a 2-star rating for its inaugural 2022-23 school year.

Overall, however, the Pinecrest network has consistently demonstrated strong outcomes across all three frameworks. A detailed record of the pertinent academic, financial, and organizational ratings for the past three years is provided in *Attachment 2 – Performance Framework Ratings* in support of this Request for Amendment (RfA).

2. If the school does NOT meet the eligibility criteria, please provide a detailed explanation justifying the request and include any supporting evidence that demonstrates the school's readiness or compelling need for the proposed amendment.

While the Pinecrest Virtual middle school did not meet the SPCSA's academic performance standards in its inaugural 2022-23 school year, earning a framework index score of 32.7, the school has demonstrated substantial and sustained improvement over the subsequent years. In 2023-24 school year, Pinecrest Virtual middle school increased its score by over 50% to 50.6, successfully meeting academic performance standards with a 3-star rating. This upward trend continued into 2024-25, with the school achieving a score of 55.0, an additional nearly 9% gain from the prior year. This consistent growth reflects the effectiveness of the school's academic interventions, leadership, and commitment to student achievement.

Amendment Synopsis

1. **Statement of Need.** Clearly explain the circumstances prompting this amendment request. Include relevant data, facts, or events that support the need for the proposed change.

Pinecrest Academy's Virtual campus was established in 2022 with an initial enrollment cap of 80 students in grades 6-10, which later increased to 170 students in grades 6-11 for the 2023-24 school year. Due to enrollment challenges, on May 17, 2024, the SPCSA approved a reduction in Virtual's enrollment cap to 135 students. The current enrollment cap for the Virtual campus, beginning in the 2024-25 school year, is 140 students.

Enrollment patterns have since shifted significantly. As of January 9, 2026, the Virtual campus serves 153 students in grades 6-12 and maintains an active waitlist of 141 students. This sustained demand demonstrates that the temporary cap reduction is no longer aligned with current interest, program capacity, or the needs of families seeking high-quality distance education. Therefore, Pinecrest respectfully seeks to

amend its charter agreement to increase its enrollment cap from 140 to 182 students, beginning in the 2026-27 school year.

2. Statement of Request. List and describe each specific amendment the school is seeking and outline how the proposed changes modify the current charter contract.

Pinecrest respectfully requests approval to amend its charter contract to increase the authorized enrollment cap for the Pinecrest Academy Virtual campus from 140 students to 182 students, effective beginning in the 2026-27 school year.

This amendment is limited in scope and modifies only the enrollment capacity provision of the charter contract applicable to the Virtual campus; no changes are proposed to grade configurations, instructional model, governance, staffing structure, or accountability requirements. The requested increase is grounded in documented enrollment trends, including current enrollment that already exceeds the existing cap and a sustained waitlist representing more than 100 percent of current capacity.

By updating the enrollment cap to 182 students, the amended charter contract will align authorization with demonstrated family demand and the program's proven ability to serve additional students while maintaining academic quality, compliance, and fiscal stability.

3. Rationale. Explain how the proposed amendment(s) directly address the identified needs or issues described in the Statement of Need. Support your explanation with evidence or anticipated benefits to students, staff, or the school community.

The proposed amendment directly addresses the needs identified in the Statement of Need by aligning the Virtual campus's authorized enrollment with demonstrated family demand, current operational capacity, and the program's proven ability to serve students effectively. Enrollment data show that the Virtual campus is successfully operating within its maximum approved capacity of 153 students, with an active waitlist of 141 additional students. This sustained demand is not speculative; it reflects a clear and ongoing shift in enrollment patterns among families seeking a flexible, high-quality distance education option that maintains academic rigor, structure, and strong instructional supports. Without an adjustment to the enrollment cap, Pinecrest Virtual must deny enrollment to students who are actively seeking admission to a program that has demonstrated both capacity and effectiveness.

Increasing the enrollment cap to 182 students allows Pinecrest to respond directly to this documented need while maintaining program quality and accountability. The Virtual campus has established staffing structures, instructional systems, and intervention supports designed to scale responsibly. Additional enrollment will enable the school to stabilize staffing, align funding with actual service levels, and expand academic and social-emotional supports proportionate to student needs. Appropriately scaled virtual programs with stable staffing and predictable funding are better positioned to deliver individualized instruction, monitor student progress, and intervene early when students fall behind.³

The anticipated benefits of the amendment extend to students, staff, and the broader school community. Students will benefit from expanded access to a high-quality virtual learning option, reduced waitlists, and increased opportunities for individualized academic support. Staff will benefit from greater program stability, sustainable staffing levels, and the ability to plan instruction and interventions based on predictable enrollment rather than constrained caps that no longer reflect reality. The school community will benefit from the long-term viability of the Virtual campus as a stable, responsive educational option that meets evolving family needs while remaining fully aligned with the charter’s original mission and accountability framework.

Importantly, this request represents a modest, data-driven adjustment rather than a fundamental change in program design or scope. The proposed enrollment increase is grounded in actual enrollment and waitlist data, aligned with Pinecrest’s existing charter authorization, and supported by the network’s demonstrated record of successful implementation and oversight. Approval of this amendment ensures that the Virtual campus can continue to grow responsibly, serve additional students who are actively seeking enrollment, and fulfill Pinecrest Academy of Nevada’s mission to provide high-quality, accessible educational options to a diverse population of families.

Pinecrest has developed a clear, deliberate, and well-sequenced timeline to ensure the successful implementation of the proposed enrollment cap increase for the Virtual campus, fully aligned with SPCSA approval processes, staffing cycles, and the school’s annual enrollment and academic planning calendar. The phased approach is designed to minimize disruption, ensure operational readiness, and maintain instructional quality as enrollment expands beginning in the 2026-27 school year.

Following SPCSA approval, Pinecrest will initiate Phase I of implementation from March through April 2026. During this period, the school will update its enrollment management and student information systems to reflect the revised enrollment cap, finalize internal planning assumptions, and prepare clear communication materials for families. Pinecrest will also begin notifying families currently on the waitlist and open intent-to-enroll confirmations, allowing the school to accurately project enrollment levels and plan staffing and course sections accordingly. This early engagement ensures transparency with families and will enable Pinecrest to align demand with available capacity well in advance of the academic year.

Phase II will occur from May through June 2026 and will focus on operational and instructional readiness. During this phase, the Registrar, counseling team, and instructional leadership will confirm student schedules, finalize course section assignments, and make any necessary staffing adjustments to support the increased enrollment. Staffing plans will be calibrated to preserve appropriate student-to-teacher ratios and ensure the continued delivery of individualized instruction, progress monitoring, and timely intervention

supports. Concurrently, Pinecrest will complete course scheduling, instructional resource alignment, and staff onboarding or professional development as needed.

By July 2026, all enrollment, staffing, and instructional preparations will be finalized, positioning the Virtual campus to begin the 2026-27 school year fully prepared to serve the expanded student population. This timeline provides sufficient lead time for approvals, stakeholder communication, and operational alignment while remaining consistent with Pinecrest's established enrollment and academic planning cycles. Collectively, these steps ensure that the proposed enrollment increase is implemented thoughtfully, responsibly, and in a manner that supports continuity for students and staff while strengthening the long-term stability and success of the Virtual campus.

School Community

The proposed amendment will impact several key stakeholder groups, each of whom stands to benefit directly from the enrollment cap increase and the continued growth of Pinecrest Academy's Virtual campus. Pinecrest has intentionally considered the needs and interests of all affected stakeholders to ensure that the proposed change is responsive, transparent, and aligned with the school's mission and capacity.

Students and Families

The primary stakeholders are current and prospective students and their families. Families seeking enrollment at the Virtual campus have demonstrated sustained demand for a flexible, rigorous, and supportive distance education option, as evidenced by current enrollment exceeding the authorized cap and a substantial active waitlist. Approval of the proposed amendment will expand access to Pinecrest's Virtual program, reduce waitlists, and allow additional students to benefit from the campus's structured academic model, individualized supports, and consistent instructional engagement. This increased access is particularly meaningful for families seeking alternatives that better meet students' academic, health, scheduling, or social-emotional needs.

Faculty and Staff

Faculty and staff are also directly impacted by the proposed amendment. Aligning the enrollment cap with actual demand enables the Virtual campus to plan staffing levels more accurately, maintain appropriate student-to-teacher ratios, and provide instructional and intervention supports at scale. Stable and predictable enrollment supports sustainable staffing, professional collaboration, and long-term program planning, all of which contribute to a high-quality teaching and learning environment.

Governing Board and EMO Support Teams

The broader Pinecrest school community, including the governing board and the school's educational management organization, will play an active role in implementing the amendment. These stakeholders are responsible for overseeing compliance, staffing, budgeting, instructional quality, and student services. The

proposed enrollment adjustment supports sound governance by ensuring that the charter contract reflects operational reality and allows leadership to allocate resources responsibly in service of student outcomes.

Community

Finally, the amendment benefits the wider community by preserving and strengthening a high-quality public virtual education option within Nevada’s public school system. By responsibly expanding capacity in response to demonstrated demand, Pinecrest continues to serve families seeking accessible, tuition-free educational alternatives while maintaining accountability, academic rigor, and fiscal stability. Collectively, these stakeholders share a vested interest in ensuring that the Virtual campus remains responsive, sustainable, and well-positioned to meet the evolving needs of students and families across the state.

2. Summarize the history of communications with these stakeholders regarding the proposed amendment(s).

Pinecrest has approached stakeholder communications regarding the proposed enrollment cap increase for the Virtual campus deliberately and responsibly, with the intent of maintaining transparency while avoiding premature expectations before authorizer action. To date, Pinecrest has not conducted formal outreach to students or families on the Virtual campus waitlist regarding the proposed amendment. Given that enrollment authorization rests with the SPCSA, the school determined that it would be inappropriate to communicate potential enrollment changes before the amendment request has been formally reviewed and approved. This approach ensures clarity, accuracy, and respect for the authorizing process while safeguarding families from receiving information that may change before final approval.

At the internal level, Pinecrest leadership and the Governing Board have engaged in ongoing discussions focused on enrollment trends, program capacity, staffing implications, and fiscal sustainability for the Virtual campus. These conversations have been informed by current enrollment data showing that the Virtual campus is operating above its authorized cap and maintaining a substantial active waitlist. Planning discussions have centered on how a modest enrollment increase can be implemented responsibly while preserving instructional quality, maintaining appropriate student-to-teacher ratios, and ensuring that academic monitoring and intervention systems remain effective as enrollment grows.

Upon SPCSA approval of the amendment, Pinecrest will implement a comprehensive and coordinated communication plan to inform all affected stakeholders, including current students and families, waitlisted families, instructional staff, and support personnel. Communications will clearly outline the approved enrollment changes, the next steps for enrollment confirmation, and the implementation timelines. This phased communication strategy ensures that stakeholders receive timely, accurate information aligned with authorizer decisions and positions the Virtual campus for a smooth and well-supported transition into the expanded enrollment period.

3. Stakeholder Impact. Explain how each stakeholder group is expected to be affected by the proposed amendment(s).

The proposed enrollment cap increase at the Pinecrest Academy Virtual campus is expected to have a positive, meaningful impact across all stakeholder groups by expanding access, strengthening program stability, and ensuring resources are aligned with demonstrated demand.

Students and Families

Students and families will experience the most direct benefit from the proposed amendment. Increasing the enrollment cap will allow Pinecrest to serve additional students who are currently unable to enroll due to capacity constraints, despite actively seeking admission to the Virtual campus. Expanded access reduces waitlists and provides more families with a high-quality, tuition-free distance education option offering academic rigor, structured instruction, and individualized support. Students will benefit from continued access to targeted interventions, progress monitoring, and consistent teacher engagement. Families will benefit from greater enrollment certainty and a program designed to meet diverse learning needs, schedules, and circumstances.

Faculty and Staff

Faculty and staff will benefit from improved program stability and more predictable enrollment levels. Aligning the enrollment cap with actual demand allows the Virtual campus to plan staffing levels responsibly, maintain appropriate student-to-teacher ratios, and allocate instructional and support resources more effectively. Predictable enrollment supports sustainable workloads, collaborative planning, and the continued delivery of high-quality instruction and intervention services, contributing to a supportive and professionally rewarding work environment.

Governing Board and EMO Support Teams

The Governing Board and EMO support teams will be positively impacted through improved alignment between the charter contract and operational reality. The proposed amendment supports sound governance by enabling leadership to plan budgets, staffing, and program supports based on authorized enrollment levels that reflect actual demand. This alignment enhances fiscal oversight, compliance, and long-term strategic planning, ensuring that the Virtual campus remains accountable, sustainable, and positioned for continued success.

Community

The broader community will benefit from the preservation and responsible expansion of a high-quality public virtual education option within Nevada's public school system. By increasing capacity in response to demonstrated demand, Pinecrest continues to serve families seeking flexible, accessible educational alternatives while maintaining accountability and academic quality. The amendment strengthens the Virtual campus's role as a stable, responsive educational partner that contributes to educational choice and equity for families across the state.

Financial Impact

1. Describe the anticipated financial impact of the proposed amendment(s).

The proposed amendment to increase the enrollment cap at Pinecrest Academy Virtual from 140 to 182 students, beginning in the 2026-27 school year, is expected to have a positive, sustainable, and manageable financial impact on the Virtual campus and the broader Pinecrest Academy of Nevada network. The requested increase aligns authorized enrollment with demonstrated demand and allows the school to stabilize funding, staffing, and program supports without introducing financial risk.

- a. What are the anticipated costs associated with the proposed amendment(s)?

The anticipated costs associated with the enrollment increase are limited and directly tied to serving additional students. These costs may include adding instructional and support staff as needed to maintain appropriate student-to-teacher ratios, as well as incremental expenditures for curriculum licenses, instructional materials, technology, and student support resources. All anticipated costs have been carefully modeled based on current staffing structures and per-pupil expenditures and are well within Pinecrest Virtual's operational and financial capacity.

- b. What is the school's plan to fund these costs (e.g., grant funding, budget reallocation, increased revenue)?

Pinecrest plans to fund these costs with existing reserves and increased per-pupil state funding associated with the approved enrollment increase. As enrollment grows, corresponding state revenue will offset incremental staffing and program costs, allowing the Virtual campus to scale responsibly without reliance on one-time funding sources or external grants. This funding approach reflects Pinecrest's conservative fiscal management practices and long-standing history of responsible budgeting and financial oversight.

- c. How will the proposed amendment(s) impact the school's current and projected budget projections?

The proposed amendment is projected to strengthen both short-term and long-term financial stability for the Virtual campus. Updated financial projections indicate that additional revenue from increased enrollment will exceed the marginal costs of expansion, resulting in improved operating margins and enhanced financial flexibility. The amendment supports predictable budgeting, sustainable staffing, and continued investment in instructional quality and student supports. Pinecrest remains confident that both the Virtual campus and the Pinecrest Academy of Nevada network will continue to meet or exceed all applicable indicators of the SPCSA Financial Performance Framework as enrollment expands in a controlled, data-driven, and fiscally responsible manner.

The Board of Directors of Pinecrest Academy of Nevada held a meeting on January 14, 2026 at 5:30 p.m. at 6151 W. Charleston Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89146.

1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Board Chair Coby Sherlock called the meeting to order at 5:48 p.m. with a quorum present. In attendance were Board members Chong Nam, Patty Charlton (arrived at 5:50 p.m.), Jennifer Williamson, Melisa Eichbauer, and Coby Sherlock.

Board members Danielle McDowell and Tyre Gray were not present.

Also in attendance were the following principals: Michael O'Dowd, Wendy Shirey, Jon Haskel, Lisa Satory, and Jessica Medina-Rodriguez. Cadence Vice Principal Lorraine Oler and Virtual Director Kristin Serrano were also in attendance. Representing Academica were Gayle Jefferson, Ryan Reeves, Kristy VanderMolen, Angie Story, Jennifer Lindemon, and Annette Christensen.

2. Public Comment

There was no public comment.

3. Consent Agenda

Member Williamson requested clarification regarding the updates to items 3b and 3e. Ms. Gayle Jefferson explained that the calendar was based on the approved minutes, and Ms. Kristy VanderMolen presented an overview of the updated Financial Policies and Procedures Manual.

Member Williamson moved to approve the consent agenda as presented. Member Eichbauer seconded the motion, and the Board voted unanimously to approve.

4. Annual Meeting

Member Charlton moved to re-elect Jennifer Williamson for a second term of 5 years to the Pinecrest Academy of Nevada Governing Board. Member Nam seconded the motion, and the Board voted unanimously to approve.

b. Annual Nomination and Election of Pinecrest Academy of Nevada Governing Board Officers

Member Sherlock nominated Chong Nam for the position of Board Chair. Member Williamson seconded the nomination, and the Board voted unanimously to elect Chong Nam as Board Chair.

Member Nam nominated Jennifer Williamson for the position of Board Vice-Chair. Member Sherlock seconded the nomination, and the Board voted unanimously to elect Jennifer Williamson as Board Vice-Chair.

Member Nam nominated Coby Sherlock for the position of Board Treasurer. Member Eichbauer seconded the nomination, and the Board voted unanimously to elect Coby Sherlock as Board Treasurer.

Member Charlton nominated Danielle McDowell for the position of Board Secretary. Member Sherlock seconded the nomination, and the Board voted unanimously to elect Danielle McDowell as Board Secretary.

5. Action & Discussion Items

a. School Initiatives Report by Principal O’Dowd, Principal Satory, Principal Rudden, Principal Shirey, Principal Haskel, and Principal Medina-Rodriguez

Lead Principal Michael O’Dowd (Inspirada) reported that the winter basketball season began successfully, the middle school JV team placed second in a pre-season tournament, and the campus hosted home basketball games for the first time in many years. He noted that staff completed active shooter response training, data meetings were scheduled to review iReady winter benchmarks, and a tutoring program for grades 3–8 was launched for students nearing proficiency. He also shared that programs were implemented to build student confidence through mentorship by varsity athletes.

Principal Lisa Satory (Sloan Canyon) reported on holiday events, ongoing field trips, and winter sports. She provided an update on transportation rollout efforts and shared that 103 conservatory students earned NMEA All-State placements, while one student received a full football scholarship to Ottawa University in Arizona.

Vice Principal Lorraine Oler (Cadence) shared that the campus reviewed midterm data with Dr. Barr and made instructional adjustments. She highlighted the launch of the Pinecrest fundraiser, a successful food and basic needs drive serving 65 families, a student-led greenhouse initiative, the formation of a student council club, recognition for five-star building status, and community marketing efforts.

Director Kristin Serrano (Virtual) reported that a student was invited to a national volleyball development program and that the campus maintained a 98 percent intent-to-return rate for the second year in a row. She noted increased dual enrollment applications, improved top ELA and math scores, upcoming parent data conferences, and streamlined access to sports at sister campuses.

Principal Wendy Shirey (Horizon) reported record mid-year benchmark growth, improvements in fifth-grade math, and the launch of a new service club. She also shared updates on holiday giving initiatives, enrichment visits, and student progress in ST Math.

Principal Jon Haskel (St. Rose) reported securing \$18,000 in Donors Choose funding, the kickoff of the Legacy fundraiser, student participation in the Henderson Holiday Parade, strong fine arts and athletics participation, community service activities, and plans for strength-based staff training.

Principal Jessica Medina-Rodriguez (Springs) reported that construction began on the new building and that marketing efforts were underway. She shared updates on data-driven interventions, expanded tutoring services, Legacy Foundation activities, PTO events, basic needs support initiatives, student recognitions, and the campus's first holiday performance.

b. Review of Current Year School Financial Performance

Ms. VanderMolen presented the financial reports through November. She reported an average daily enrollment of 8,467 students across the Pinecrest system and a net income of \$145,927 for cash items only. She also provided explanations for income and expense variances of 10 percent or greater and noted that beginning-of-year expenses were typically higher due to purchases such as computers, furniture, textbooks, software, and the payment of bonuses.

c. Review and Approval of the Pinecrest Academy of Nevada Single Audit

Ms. VanderMolen reviewed the single audit for federal funds and reported that the audit was very successful, with no findings or issues. She stated that both the financial statement audit and the federal awards audit received clean opinions, with no significant deficiencies or material weaknesses identified. She noted that the two major programs audited were the child nutrition cluster and the coronavirus program, and she thanked the board, principals, office managers, and supporting staff for their oversight of federal funds.

Member Nam moved to approve the single audit. Member Charlton seconded the motion, and the Board voted unanimously to approve.

Ms. Jefferson explained that the Board must approve maximum enrollment for the upcoming year. The only significant change was for the Springs campus due to the new building. Virtual enrollment might also change pending approval of an increase.

Member Charlton moved to approve the maximum grade-level enrollment for the 2026/2027 school year. Member Williamson seconded the motion, and the Board voted unanimously to approve.

e. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the Amended Pinecrest Academy of Nevada Transfer Policy

Ms. Jefferson presented a proposed amendment to the transfer policy to address challenges with families accepting seats at one campus but transferring before the school year begins when their name comes up on the waitlist at another campus. The change would require that when families accept a spot at a Pinecrest campus, they are removed from waitlists at other Pinecrest campuses and must commit to that campus for one year.

Board members discussed how this would affect siblings applying to multiple campuses, with clarification that parents would need to decide which campus to choose when one sibling is accepted. The board also discussed the need to make this policy clear to parents during the application and acceptance process.

Member Sherlock moved to amend the Pinecrest transfer policy so that when a student accepts enrollment at a Pinecrest campus, they will be removed from all other Pinecrest waitlists. The motion also included adding this policy to admissions policies and creating a comprehensive admissions and transfer policy packet to support the community. Member Charlton seconded the motion, and the Board voted unanimously to approve.

f. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding RFP for Banking

Chair Nam explained that the RFP went to multiple banks, with two finalists (NSB and Waffet) that ranked first and second nationally for services to schools. No formal decision had been made, and the recommendation was to leave this as an open item to investigate further in early spring or summer. **The item was tabled.**

g. Update Regarding Springs Campus

Mr. Ryan Reeves, representing Academica Nevada, provided an update on the Pinecrest Springs campus construction. He reported that XL Charter was serving in a construction management role for Pinecrest and that ownership of the building had transferred to Pinecrest through the purchase and bond financing. He explained that initial price estimates were higher than anticipated, but the bidding process reduced the cost to approximately \$900,000 below the target budget, allowing for the potential inclusion

of additional projects. He also shared that Principal Medina met with Mr. Howell from XL Charter to discuss outdoor improvements, including turf replacement and an additional playground, and that demolition of interior walls had begun.

Board members raised concerns regarding the elevator, noting prior discussions about relocating the elevator outside the building to achieve cost savings. The board emphasized the importance of maintaining safety by ensuring the elevator door opened to the interior of the building, even if the shaft was located externally. They requested additional information on this issue as soon as possible, along with a detailed budget comparing revised budget figures to actual costs.

6. Board Member Closing Comments and Feedback

Member Sherlock encouraged everyone to support the fundraiser and offered to assist with connecting potential business sponsors. He expressed pride in the schools' work and emphasized the importance of maintaining the integrity of the Pinecrest brand.

Member Eichbauer congratulated the schools on their five-star ratings and recognition.

Chair Nam thanked everyone and pledged the Board's continued support for the principals and campuses.

The next regularly scheduled meeting was announced for March 11, 2026 at 5:30 p.m.

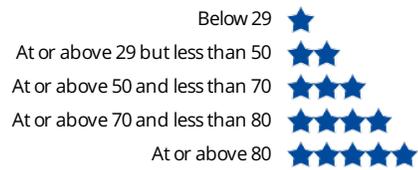

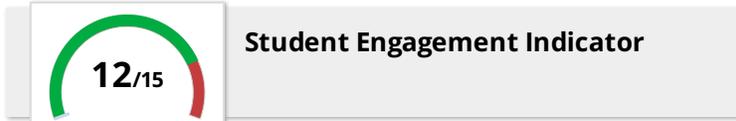

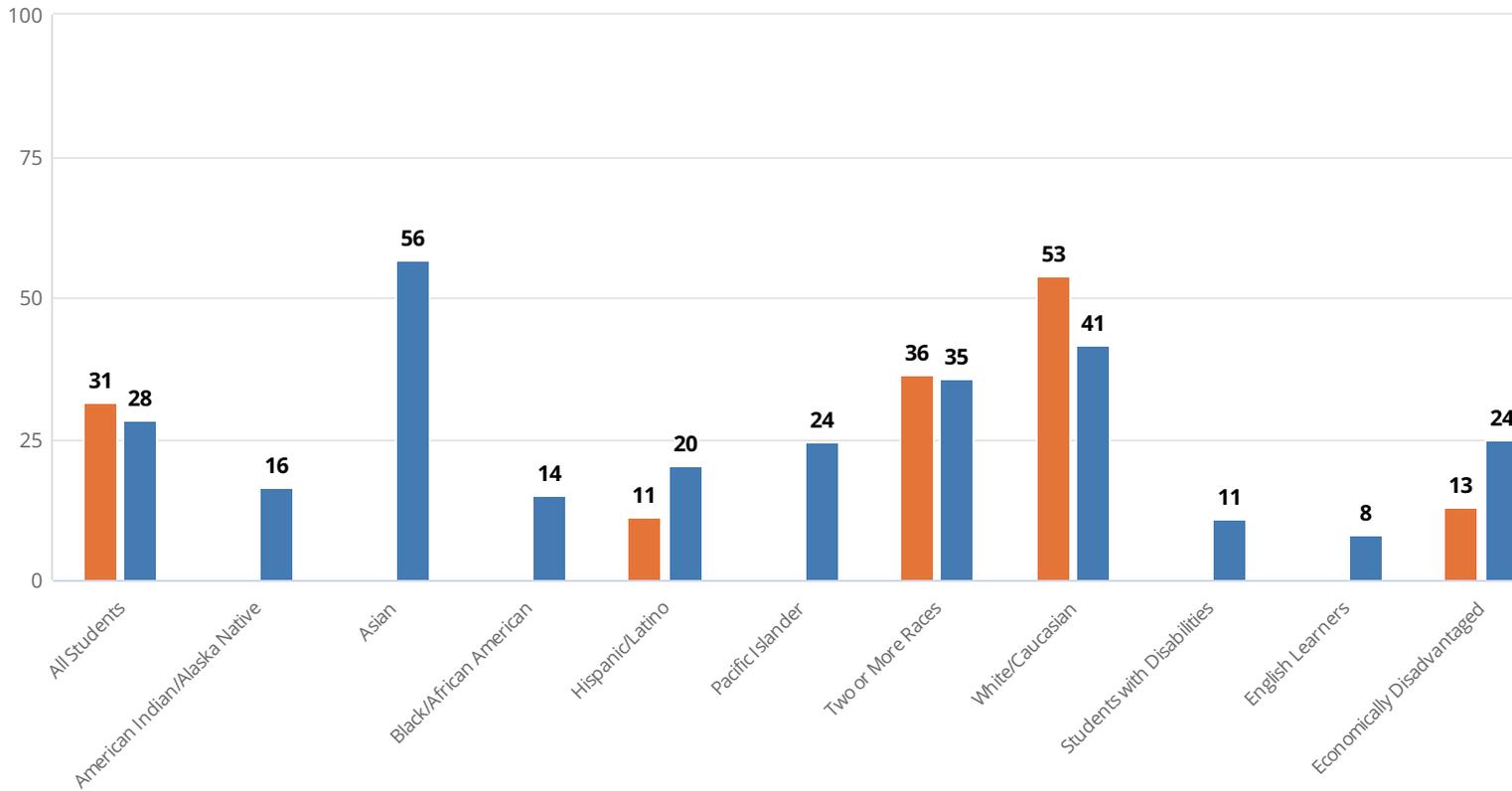

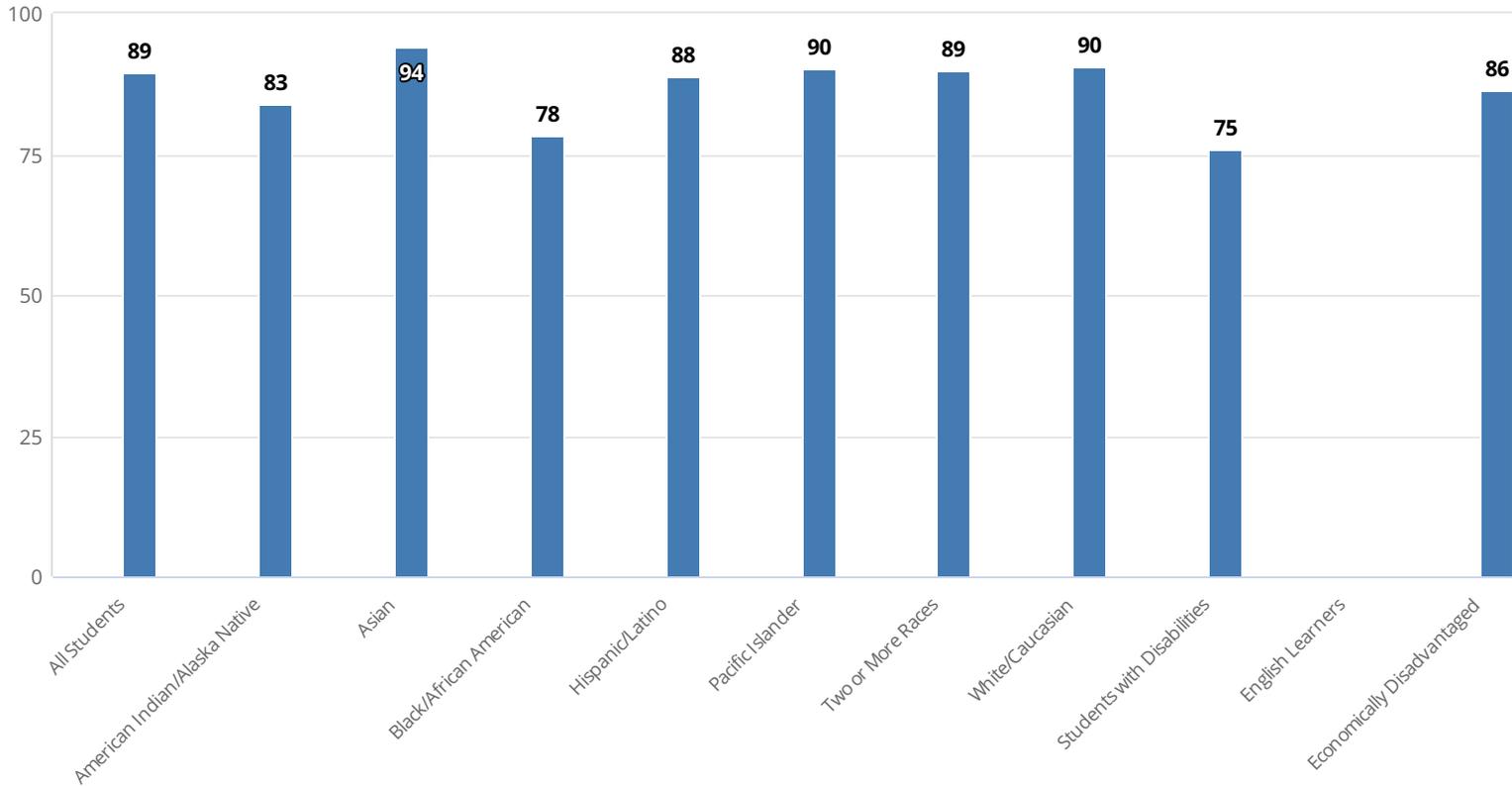

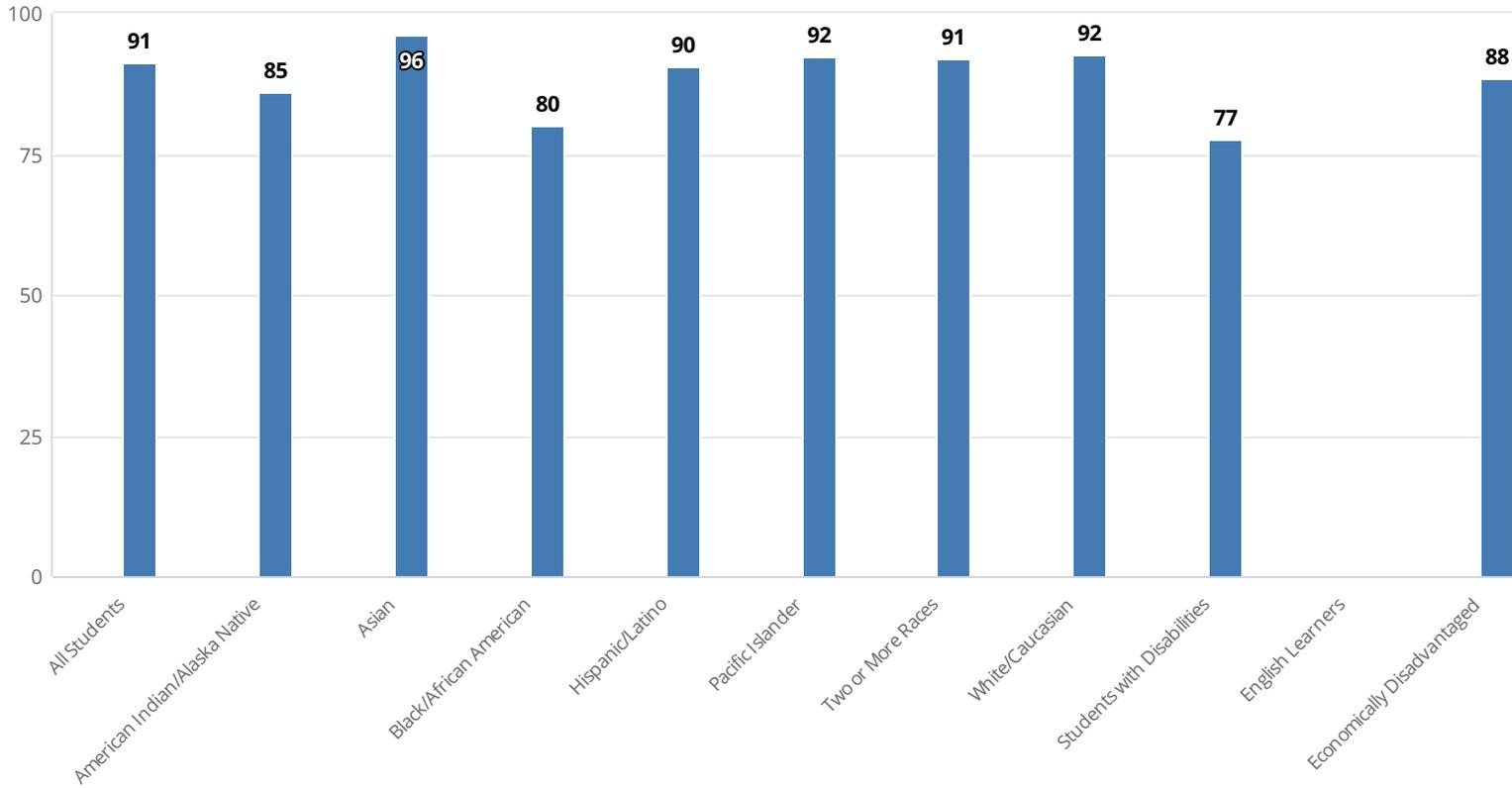

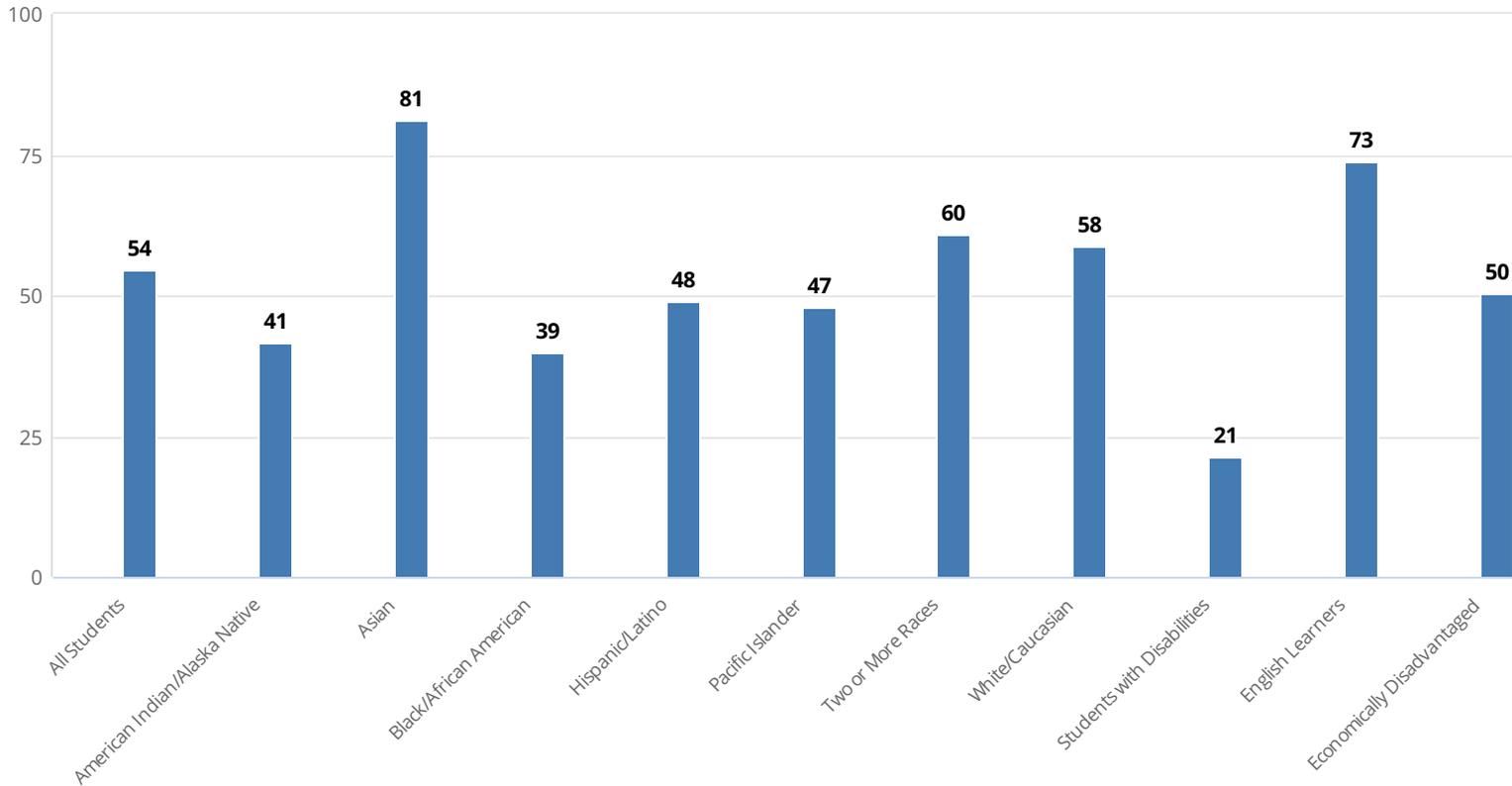

Student Growth

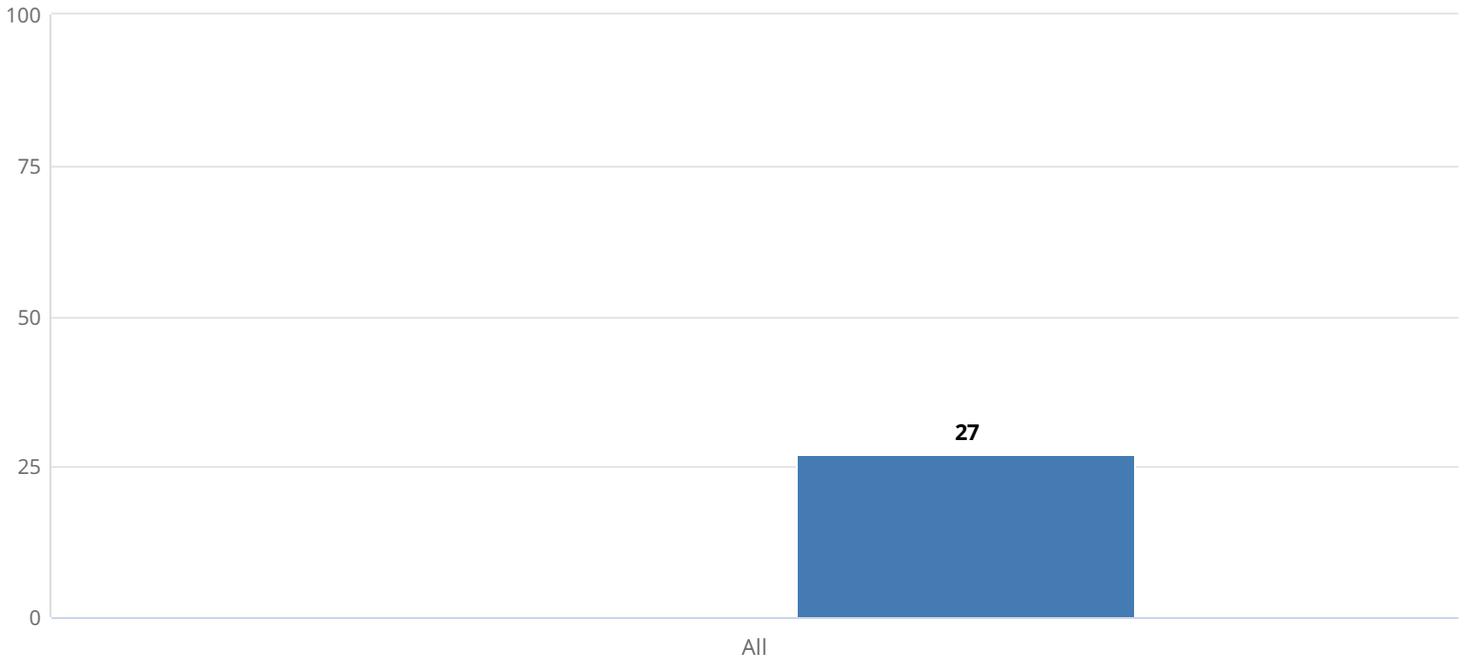

Student Engagement

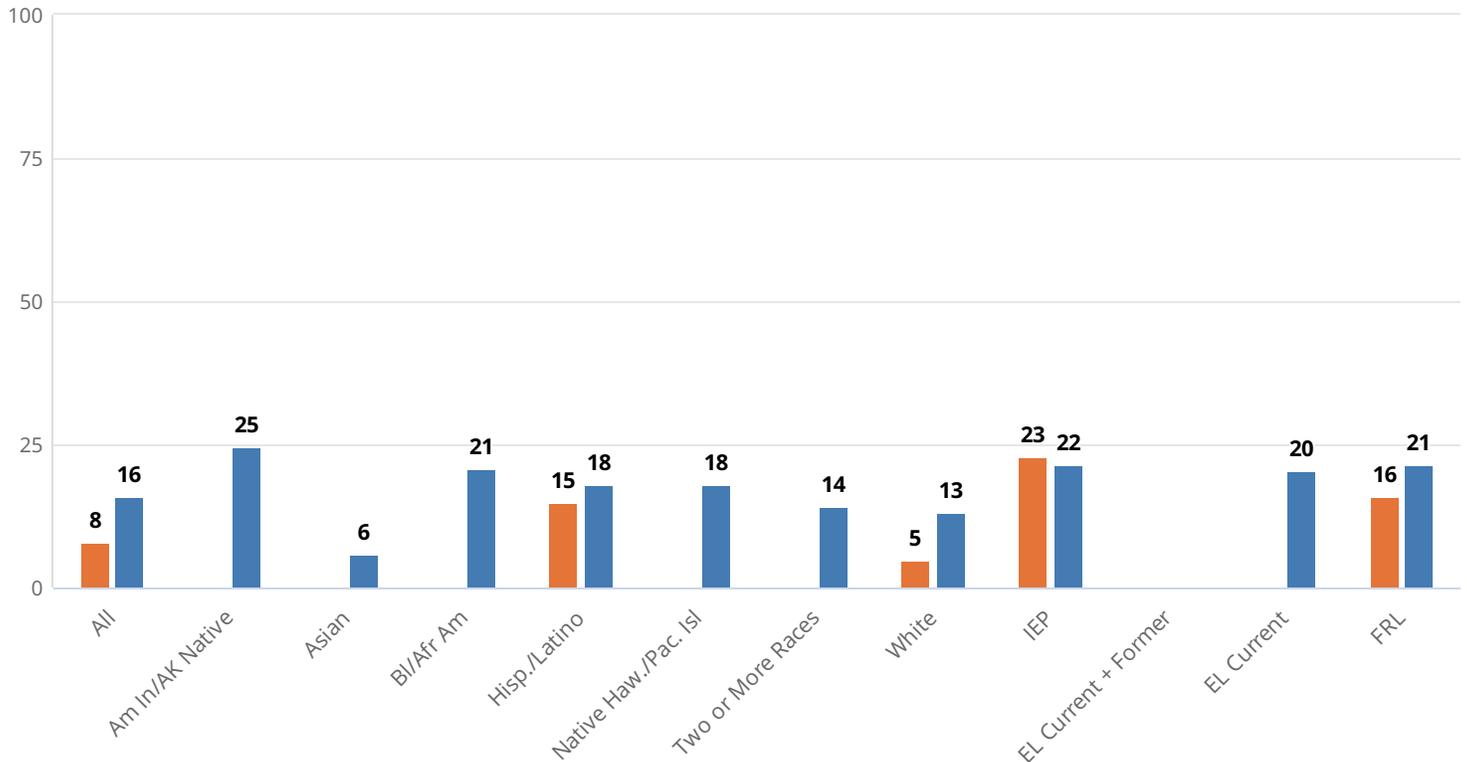

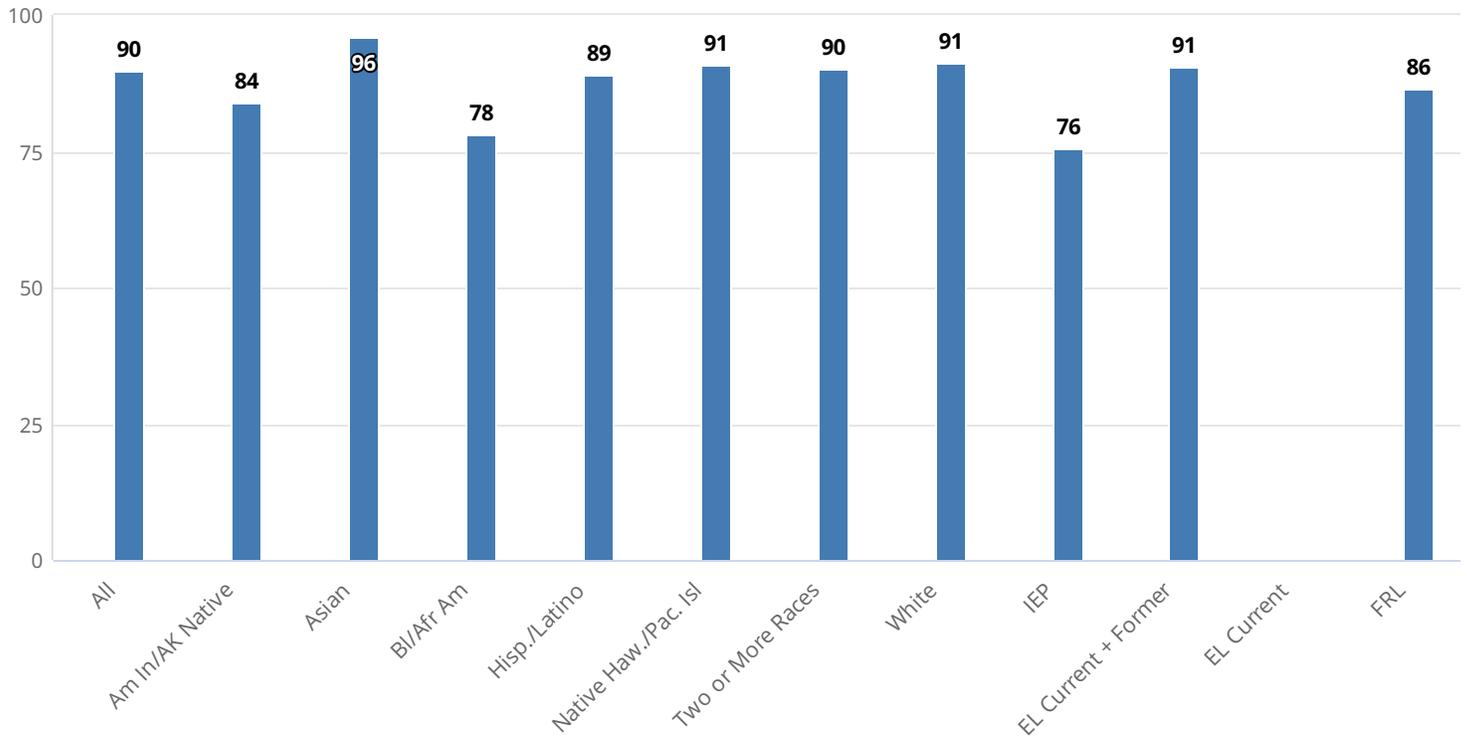

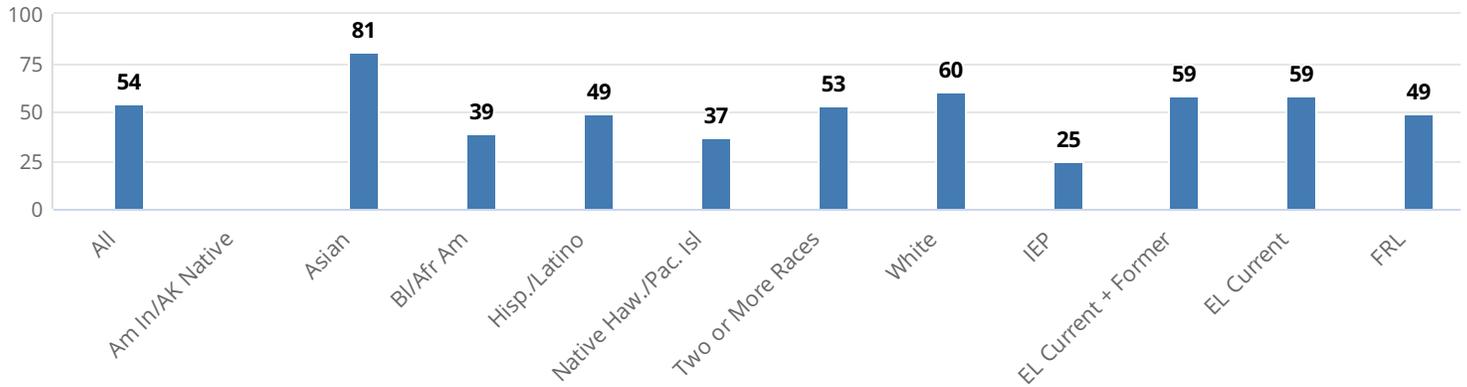

The IB Diploma Program is a two-year comprehensive and rigorous pre-university curriculum leading to an IB diploma. The IB Program was designed through an international cooperative effort and is based in Geneva, Switzerland. Both the Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate Programs give high school students an opportunity to pursue college-level studies while still in high school. DC/DE allows students to take college courses while still in high school. Students can earn college credits upon successful completion of the coursework. CTE provides students with the academic and technical skills, knowledge and training necessary to succeed in future careers by introducing them to workplace competencies, and makes academic content accessible to students by providing it in a hands-on context. Note that not all schools in Nevada have all these programs available. For example, only a few schools in the state offer an IB program.

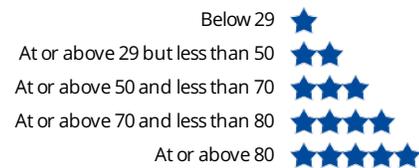

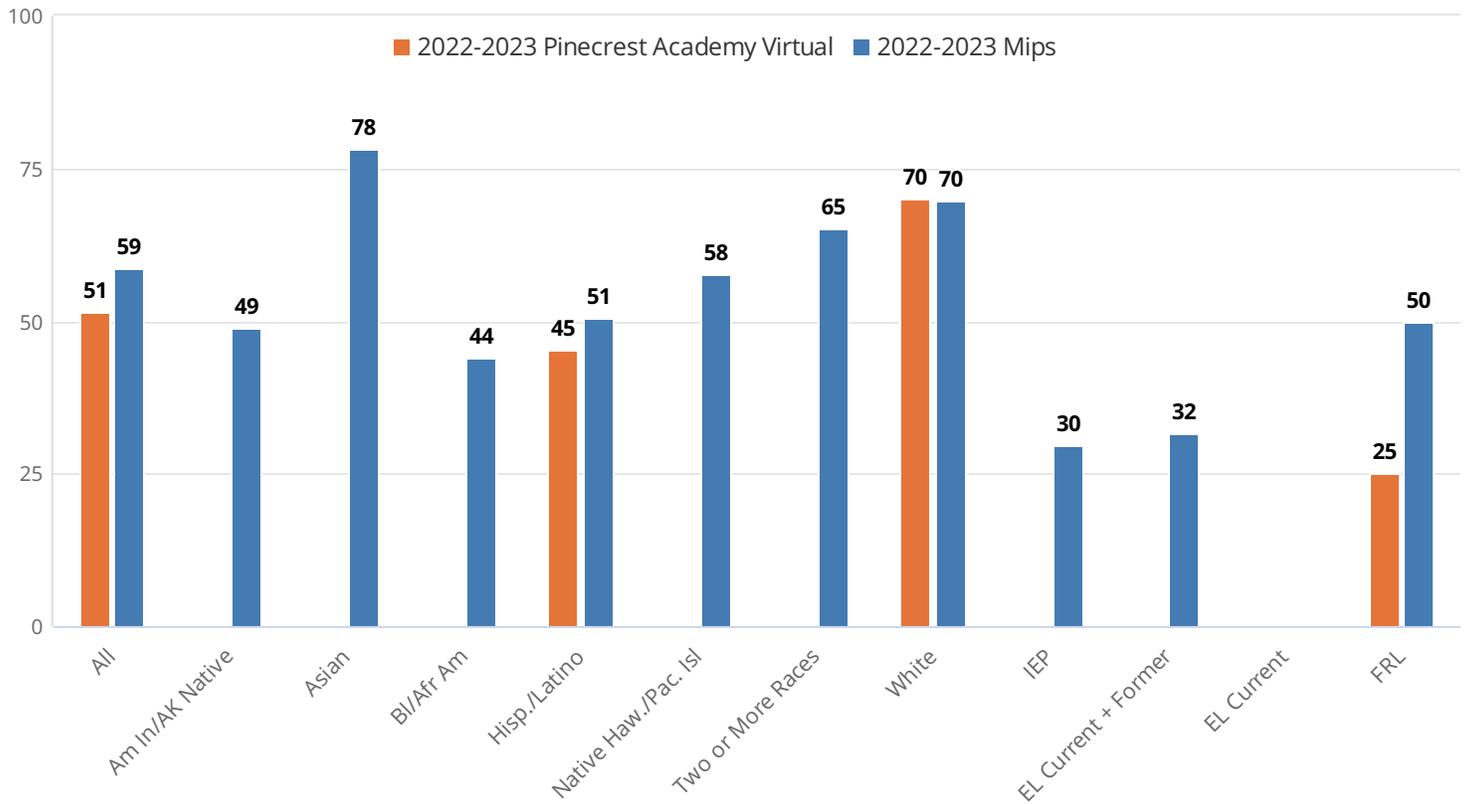

Student Growth

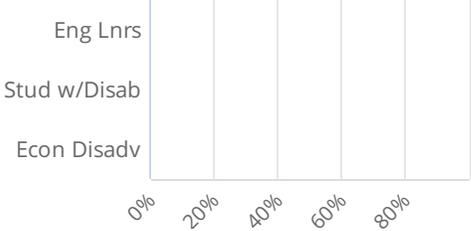

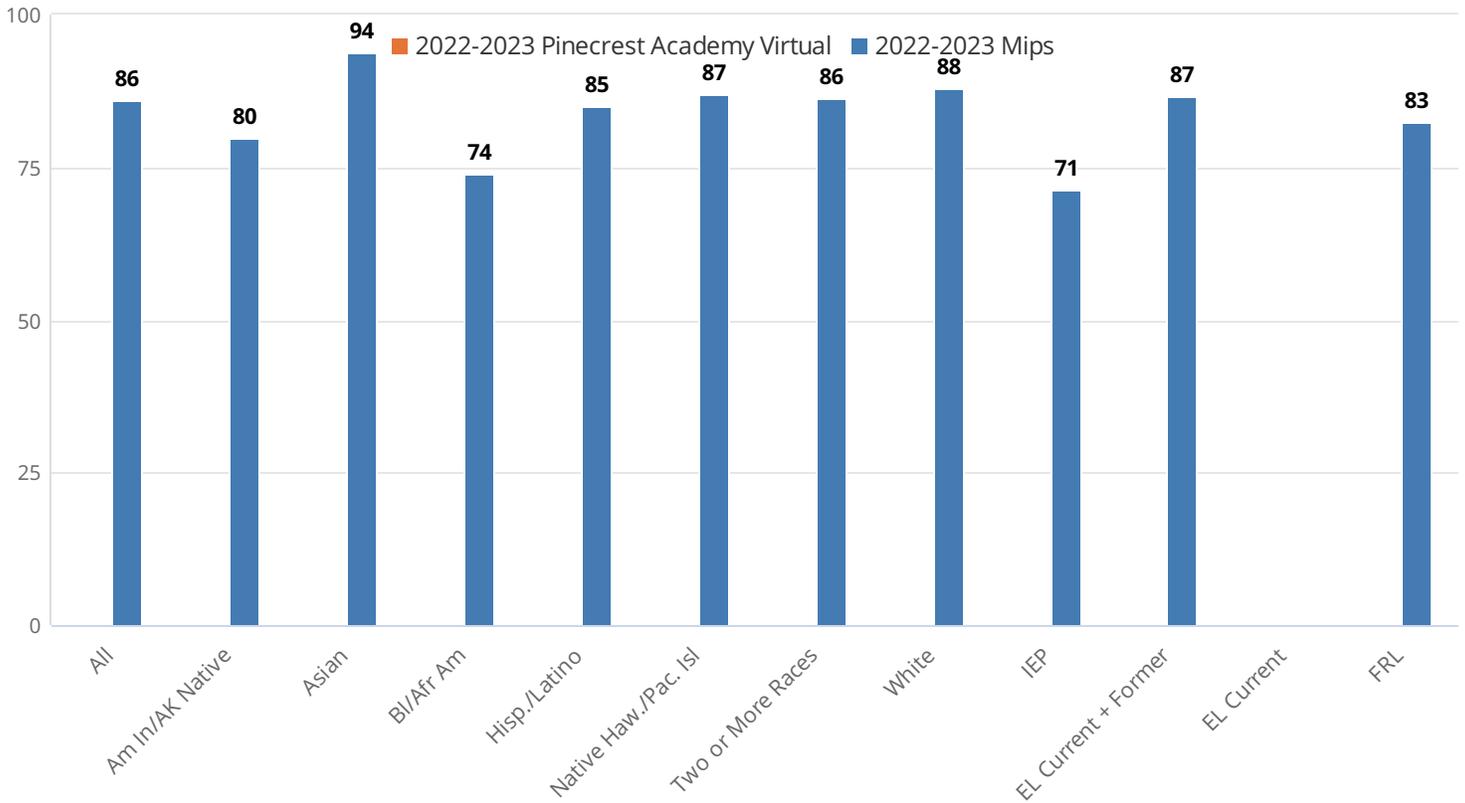

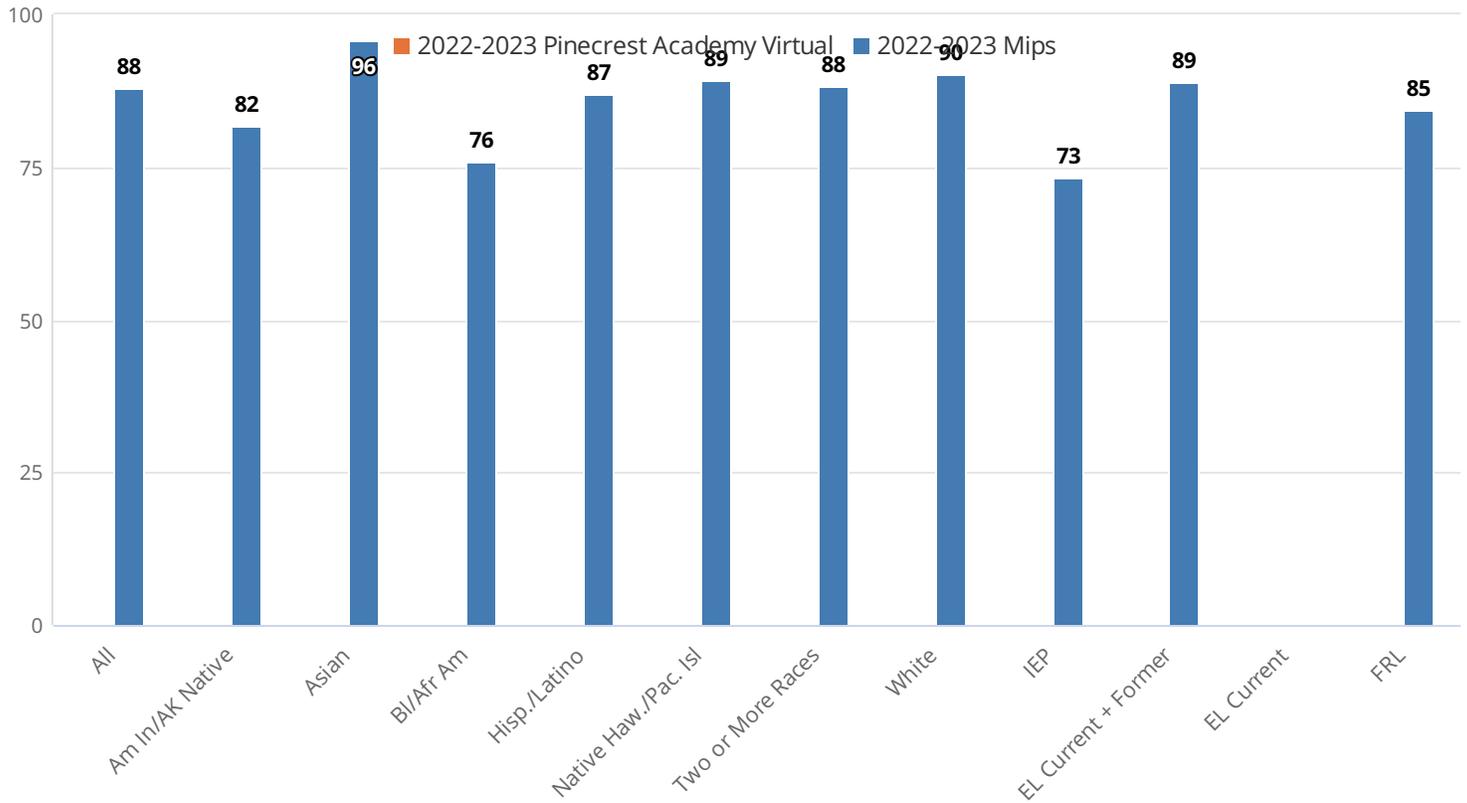

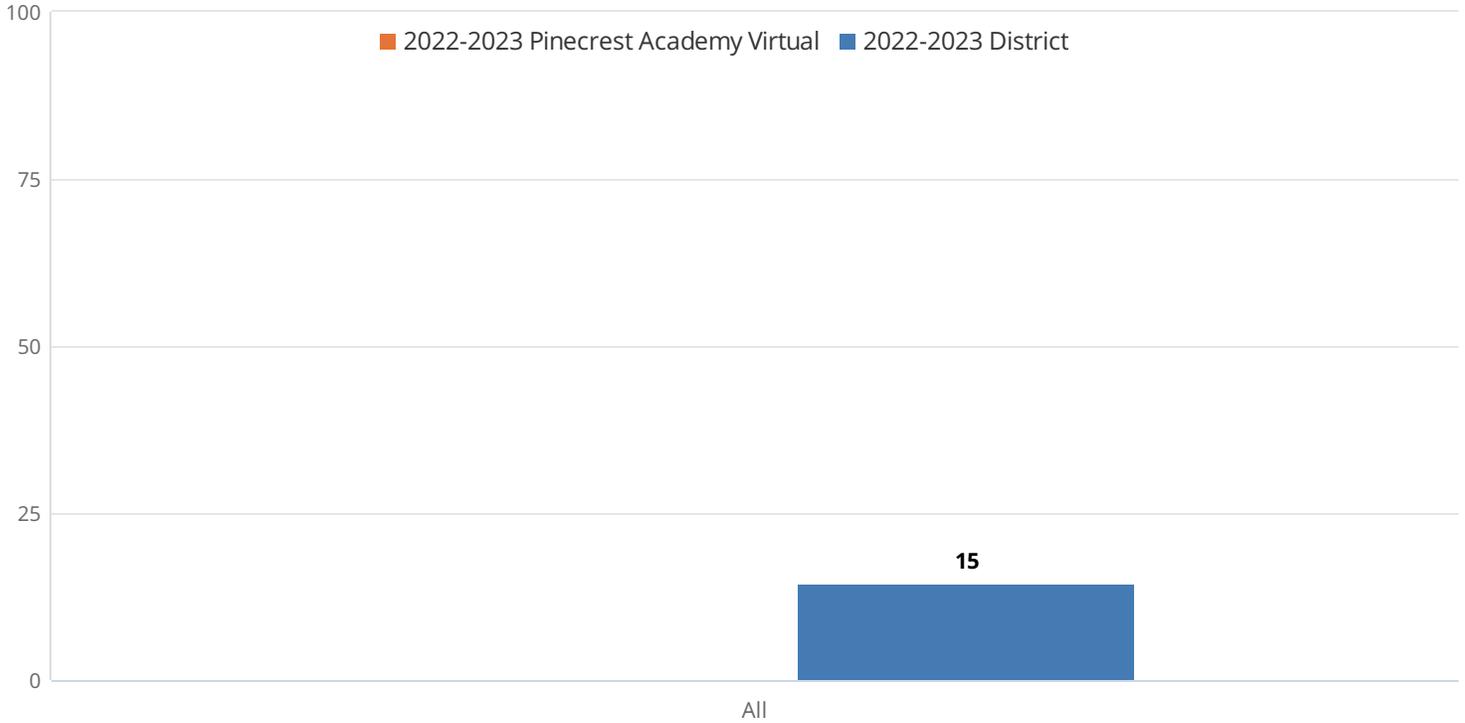

The four programs that are used in Nevada are Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), DualCredit/Dual Enrollment (DC/DE), and Career and Technical Education (CTE). The AP is a program created by the College Board offering college-level curriculum and examinations to high school students. Colleges often grant placement and credit to students who obtain high scores on the examinations. The IB Diploma Program is a two-year comprehensive and rigorous pre-university curriculum leading to an IB diploma. The IB Program was designed through an international cooperative effort and is based in Geneva, Switzerland. Both the Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate Programs give high school students an opportunity to pursue college-level studies while still in high school. DC/DE allows students to take college courses while still in high school. Students can earn college credits upon successful completion of the coursework. CTE provides students with the academic and technical skills, knowledge and training necessary to succeed in future careers by introducing them to workplace competencies, and makes academic content accessible to students by providing it in a hands-on context. Note that not all schools in Nevada have all these programs available. For example, only a few schools in the state offer an IB program.

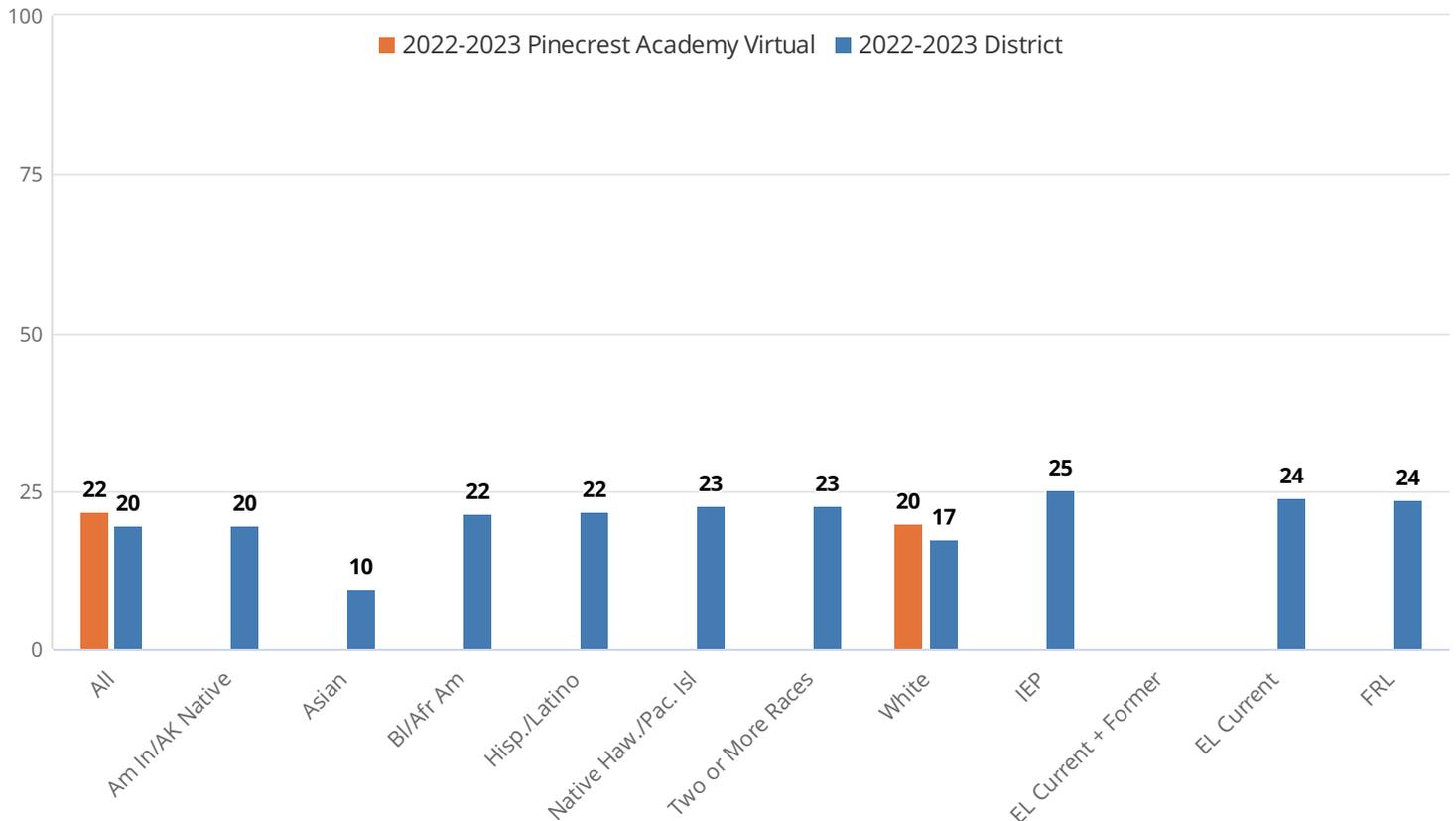

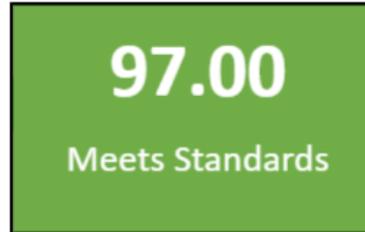
