DATE: March 13, 2026

Summary of Request and Recommendation

Young Women’s Leadership Academy (YWLA) has submitted an amendment application requesting that the State Public Charter School Authority (SPCSA) grant a Good Cause Exemption and approve the request to reduce its enrollment cap.

SPCSA staff has reviewed the application and recommends that the Authority grant the Good Cause Exemption and approve the amendment request. A proposed motion can be found on page 2 of this memo.

Background and Overview of the Amendment

YWLA is located at 3415 S. Mojave Rd. in Las Vegas, Nevada 89121 in Clark County. YWLA is affiliated with the Young Women Leadership Schools network of all-girls college prep schools all driven by the same mission and vision: to nurture the intellectual curiosity and creativity of young women. Young Women’s Leadership Schools accomplish this by supporting the “whole girl” and seek to maximize the academic achievement, social emotional well-being, and post-secondary success of each student. As of the 2025 Validation Day, YWLA had 108 students enrolled in grades 6 – 10.

According to the amendment application, the reduced cap will serve as the baseline for enrollment planning in future years. YWLA will continue implementing targeted, data-driven recruitment activities to build sustainable enrollment while maintaining compliance with the 10-percent variance requirement. The governing board will monitor enrollment trends, academic outcomes, and financial performance annually to determine whether adjustments or future amendment requests are warranted as the school grows and stabilizes. The projected enrollment in the middle school grades is expected to support stronger student enrollment for 2026-27 and beyond and the school will add grades 11 and 12 over the

next two school years.

Additionally, according to the amendment application, to retain current students and reassure families, YWLA will actively reinforce the advantages of our educational model, such as small class sizes that enable increased teacher-student interaction and our ongoing efforts to improve academic outcomes. In addition to student retention, YWLA has also taken steps to increase marketing for new students, continues to work with community partners to increase awareness of YWLA.

Finally, YWLA presented a fiscally conservative budget and YWLA noted that as student enrollment is lower than expected, some budgeted expenses decreased as a result; these include EMO/CMO Fees, student supplies, IT fees, etc. According to the amendment application, YWLA will look to apply for grants deemed beneficial to the school to further support the planning and implementation of the charter. YWLA will continue to pursue funding for schools available under Titles I, II, III, and/or IVA.

Legal Authority

Existing charter schools that are sponsored by the SPCSA may submit a charter school contract amendment application to the SPCSA – which is reviewed by SPCSA staff and presented for SPCSA Board action – in order to, among other things, increase enrollment, add grade levels above and beyond what the charter school is approved to serve, or add a new campus. When determining whether to approve an amendment request, the sponsor considers the charter school’s compliance with applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations and evidence relating to the academics, finance and organization of the charter school. (See NAC 388A.400(8) and NRS 388A.276).

Analysis and Staff Recommendation

When reviewing an amendment application for RFA eligibility, SPCSA staff reviews the academic, financial and organizational performance of the applicant charter school. Regarding YWLA’s academic performance, the middle school was rated as 3-stars and received 53.5 points on the SPCSA’s Academic Performance Framework, which met standards. The high school was not rated. YWLA was rated as In-Compliance on the 2024 – 25 Organizational Performance Framework. YWLA is operating under a Notice of Concern which was continued at the January 23, 2026 board SPCSA board meeting.

SPCSA staff is in support of YWLA to reduce its enrollment cap. SPCSA staff does have ongoing concerns regarding the continued under enrollment of the school over the first four years of its operation but is recommending approval of this amendment to bring the school’s enrollment cap in the charter contract into alignment with the enrollment of the school.

Proposed Motion: Grant YWLA’s Good Cause Exemption request and approve YWLA’s request to reduce the enrollment cap as outlined in the recommendation memo.
